# A great big Thank You to all who contributed to the Center in 2019!

Central Avenue Center of Hope has been very blessed over the last several years. Last year we made our budget for 2019. We exceeded our budget due to contributions, grants, Faithful 50 and the thrift store.

The Center received 2,500 pairs of socks from Bombas socks. We also had a washer and dryer donated to the center. We had monetary donations from: Church of the Brethren, Charities Aid Foundation, Bonner Springs Community of Christ, Spectrum Health Foundation, Church of the Brethren's Youth Camp, and many other groups and individuals. Mission Road Community of Christ gave Easter books for the children and collected school supplies. Oak Ridge Baptist did a clothes drive. The Center received Bethel Community of Christ garage sale remains.

Several groups provided meals or served meals over the last year. Some of them were Camp Hermon Junior Camp, Salem Missionary Baptist, Colonial Hills Youth, Casa de Dios, Liberty Community of Christ, Church of the Brethren, Olathe Community of Christ, Cowboys, Shawnee Drive Community of Christ, CCW, UM Omega Sonority, Highlands Community of Christ and many others.

Highlands Community of Christ had an angel tree at Christmas and reverse advent that donated items to Central Avenue. We received 11,621-lbs. food from the Postal Food Drive. The CARD Drive brought in 875-lbs. food. Feed the Elderly served 22 households.

Project Warmth provided coats, blankets, gloves & scarves. Paper Goods Drive went great. Excelsior Springs Community of Christ won the contest.

The Christmas Store served 42 parents/grandparents, 190 children. We served 97 meals and those attending the Christmas meal received a gift.

We are grateful to have coats, caps, gloves and scarves to give to people that need them. We provide a warm place to be for a little while during the winter months.

The new year has brought us challenges with the weather. Our main entrance is off an alley that the city does not treat. With the icy conditions, it's not an easy task to get to the Center and get inside safely. We have closed a few days to keep our volunteers and clients safe. The snow doesn't slow us down much but the ice does.

We are planning ahead with programs for 2020. We start the CARD Drive this month. This helps us have plenty of food for our pantry and meals. On March 21<sup>st</sup> we'll have our Appreciation Dinner for volunteers and donators of the Center. The second Saturday in May will be the Postal Food Drive which will bring us an abundance of shelf stable food.

We had a group of youth from the TWIST weekend come on January 25. They helped sort can goods at the center. In March we'll have a youth group serve our lunch time meal.

We really appreciate all the support of funds, donations of food, clothing, household items and all items that are given to the Center. That's what keeps this ministry going.
