On the way to the top of the Grand Mesa, the Aussies enjoyed the view and the cooler temperatures.



When the sun comes out, we say it is clearing UP. When it rains, it soaks UP the earth. When it does not rain for a while, things dry UP. One could go on and on, but I'll wrap it UP, now . . . My time is UP! Oh... One more thing: What is the first thing you do in the morning and the last thing you do at night? U P! Did that one crack you UP? Don't screw UP. Send this on to everyone you look UP in your address book. Or not. It's UP to you.
