REGULATIONS

MEMBERS PRIVILEGES

- Each subscriber of \$15 (pensioners \$8) annually, to be a Member of the Society with a voice and vote in its proceedings. A subscriber of \$15 shall have 2 (two) adult tickets, & 3 (three) student tickets. A subscriber of \$8 (pensioners) shall have 2 (two) tickets. A single person membership of \$8 is available on application. Membership for school aged children U16 is \$2. Your membership of the Society is an investment in your districts progress, as well as a privilege and benefit to you.
- 2. The Show Grounds will be open from 8 am. Members admitted on production of ticket: non-members \$8, pensioners \$4, children 7-15yrs \$2 and under 7 years free. Car parking space for invalids and semi-invalids adjacent to main entrance. Pensioner card is needed to be produced proving the identity of the persons concerned. No admission refund will be given to any firm, life or ordinary member or any person whatsoever, because of loss of any ticket or pass.
- 3. Entries in all cases should be made on the form provided by the Society, and addressed to the Secretary, PO Box 244, MANNUM SA 5238 or emailed to secretary@mannumshow.org
- 4. Entries will close as per the heading in each section. NO late entries will be accepted in any section after closing time.
- 5. Live stock exhibits will be received at the Show yards in accordance to information in appropriate sections. Horses-In-Action events will commence at 8.30am. All exhibitors in this section must be members of the Mannum Agricultural Society. Exhibitors 16 years and under are exempt from this clause except in the Horses-In-Action.
- 6. Horse stock to be led around as the Judges may direct.

- 7. **Produce and other "inside" exhibits received up to 9.30 am.** They must be placed in the space allotted by the committee, or whom they may appoint, and must not be removed before 8.00 pm.
- 8. Any exhibitor removing his or her property before the above stated times, will forfeit his/her prize, if entitled to any, and if not, may be barred from exhibiting again at any of the Society 's Shows.
- All produce entered for competition must be the production of the present season and must have been grown, produced or manufactured by the exhibitor.
- 10. Livestock except Fat Sheep and horses, must be the bona-fide property of the exhibitor.
- 11. All exhibitors and the public must leave the buildings, cattle yards and show ring while the judges are giving their decisions.
- 12. No-one but the committee members and the person in charge are al lowed in the ring at the time of judging, except those invited by the President.
- 13. The judges are empowered to withhold prizes where exhibits are consid ered unworthy, or they may award second or third prizes in lieu of first and second.
- 14. The judges are empowered to reject any entry in the Sheep Section which, in their opinion, has not complied with the Society's shearing regulations.
- 15. Competitors may affix their name and selling price on their exhibits after the judges have made their awards, but in no circumstances before then.
- 16. Interference with or alteration to tickets either by competitors or the public is strictly prohibited; all exhibits of any competitor so interfering will be liable to disqualification. The attention of the Secretary or Stew ards should be called to any supposed error.

- 17. Any exhibitor giving the wrong description of his or her exhibits with the intention of deceiving or defrauding the Society shall forfeit the prize to which he or she may be entitled, and be debarred from exhibiting at any future show, and the particulars of the case shall be published in the Society's proceedings.
- 18. Protests must be lodged in writing with the Secretary on the day of the Show, accompanied by \$20 to be forfeited if the protest be deemed frivolous.
- 19. The committee will endeavour to protect exhibits from damage or loss but will not be in any way responsible for them.
- 20. Exhibitors are requested to note the time for taking entries and receiving exhibits.
- 21. All vehicles entering the grounds must park where directed by the Stewards
- 22. Trade passes will be issued by the Secretary and NO REFUNDS shall be given to any person or firm paying admission fees because of the loss of such Trade Passes. All Trade passes shall be handed to the gate attendants.

1 Competitors to compete in only one of the following sections

Junior OpenUnder 18male/femaleSenior Open18 and overmale/female

- 2 Only the longest throw of each individual will be recorded for qualifying into the finals. Top three competitors for each section qualify for the final.
- Tickets need to be purchased at \$1.00 each. A ticket will entitle the Competitor to one throw.
- 4 Weights of fish may vary slightly within each section.
- Fish, as supplied, to be thrown into the 'fair' area from a line within the cricket nets. A throw from on or in front of the line will be called 'foul' and counted as a throw but not measured. Fish hitting the nets will also be called 'foul'.
- 6 Previously thrown fish which are still whole, at the judge's discretion, may be made available for further throws

CONDITIONS

- 1 Stallions are not eligible to compete in hack classes.
- 2 All riding competitors must wear approved safety helmets and riding boots.
- 3 Horses are not to be lunged on the exercise area after 8.30 am.
- 4 Events will not necessarily be run in the order printed in this catalogue. Classes with insufficient entries will be combined.
- There will not be any transferring of entries between classes after submission of entry except in 6 below
- In the case of a horse being measured prior to the show, and a transfer being required, the current height certificate must be in the hands of the convenor by 5pm on the evening before the show.

- 7 Any coaching during judging (excepting Lead line Classes) is strictly prohibited. Judges may disqualify entrants at their discretion.
- 8 Protests must be lodged with the Secretary along with \$100, within 30 minutes of the contested class completion.
- 9 Refunds of entry fees only on receipt of a veterinary certificate naming the horse or a medical certificate for the rider.
- 10 Led competitors and mount combinations are not eligible for horses in action competition.
- 11 No unauthorised person/s will be allowed to enter the rings during judging unless granted permission by the convenor.




