Call meeting to order/roll call

Craig Barber called the meeting to order at 4:30 P.M. Barber – Vice Chair, Heather Enzi – Member, Kayla Musselman – Member, were in attendance. Robert Spivey, Jr. – Clerk arrived at 4:31 P.M.

Pledge of Allegiance

The pledge of allegiance was recited.

General Public Comment (FIRST)

No comment.

Approval of the October 8, 2019 agenda

Enzi motioned to approve. Musselman seconded; motion passed 3-0. October 8, 2019 agenda is approved.

Presentation by the United States Census Bureau regarding the 2020 Census

Glen Marsh showed PowerPoint and reviewed the Census. Lorina is the head of the County Complete Count Committee. Can set up a local Complete Count Committee and he will help.

Arnold Knightly mentioned that he is the county PIO and if we need anything, we can reach out to him.

Lorina Dellinger, Assistant County Manager, mentioned that it's important to reach out to the community as any funding for medical services is very crucial, so it's good to explain to people that it's okay to reach out.

Knightly mentions that it was talked about setting up a central location where people can come and do the census whether it be a library or community center.

Marsh mentions that if you go to 2020census.gov/partners all the information can be printed and a lot more information is available.

Approval of September 24, 2019 meeting minutes

Enzi motioned to approve. Musselman seconded; motion passed 4-0. September 24, 2019 meeting minutes are approved.

Discussion, deliberation, and possible decision to approve, amend, and approve draft resolution to return fuel tax monies to Nye County held in Town of Round Mountain's General Fund

Olmedo mentioned the three items we received from the Public Works director's office resolutions 92-10, 95-01, and 95-06.

<u>Discussion, deliberation, and possible decision to create, adopt, and or modify the current Declarations of</u> <u>Reservations for the Hadley Subdivision of Round Mountain</u>

Olmedo asked if they still want to modify. Barber mentioned the Board making a list of their own and then bringing it back and discussing them all.

Olmedo asked Lorina if there is anything they can do locally before sending it off as nuisance to the BOCC. Dellinger explains that the only thing similar is Gabbs, which is an advisory board, believes they've done some sort of clean up effort by notifying owners of complaints received prior to going to the BOCC. There were efforts made but legally they can't enforce as they are to code enforcement. It was more of a request to clean up. Olmedo mentions that we are trying to enforce as the issues we are running into is, you can send us all the letters you want but what are you guys going to do? They want to see an NRS or Nye County Code. Dellinger mentions that within Chapter 269 we do have code enforcement opportunities by hiring a part time code compliance officer, for example, which is in the provisions of Chapter 269.

Musselman asked if it would just be for the residential area or also for the horse corrals.

Olmedo explained that we will need to search and see if there are any Declarations of Reservations for the corrals as it is its own entity.

<u>Discussion, deliberation, and possible decision to sponsor a Hadley Subdivision contest – "Most Improved</u> <u>Residence" and "Runner Up", with Town of Round Mountain awarding the winner with one-year free</u> water service, valuing \$330.00; and the runner up with six months free water service valuing \$165.00

Olmedo explains that we reached out to auditor to ensure this is something we can do and we have not heard a response back. Just took water only with is a value of \$27.50 did not incorporate the service fee or the sewage charge. Suggests to table this item until we hear back from the auditor as well as have a full quorum.

Musselman explains that the mine has a donation board with paperwork to fill out for then to sponsor, she could get the paperwork to fill out.
