Small Service Project Update

Five lap guilts were turned in at the September meetings and two were made from the large fabric donation from Janet Baker. A total of six lap guilts were delivered to Riverside Hospital on October 20th for patients receiving cancer treatment at the Peninsula Cancer Institute. Our total delivered for the year is seventy and I think we can break one hundred. Kathie Kline and JoAnn Garner won the prizes for turning in quilts from the kits in October. More fabric kits were signed out at the October meetings and I have about ten left. Five comfort guilts for babies in NICU, twenty-five fabric hearts and eight bereavement quilts were turned in, also. Three comfort quilts were from the kits. Thank you for supporting Small Service Projects in the following ways:

- Lap quilts approximately 32" x 38" for cancer patients at Riverside Hospital.
- Small comfort quilts approximately 24" to 36" for babies in NICU at CHKD and Portsmouth Naval Hospital that get to go home but don't have a good prognosis.
- Approximately 26-inch square bereavement quilts are needed at CHKD. Please use muted and pastel colors for these quilts that are appropriate for grieving parents.
- Fabric hearts for the parents of babies in NICU at CHKD, Portsmouth and Riverside Hospitals. The fabric hearts have been very popular and it is a good way to use left over fabric. The pattern is on the website under Service Projects. You can use cotton or flannel or both.

President Isobel Meekins thanked the Challenge Quilt committee for their work on this year's challenge. Thanks to Susan Waddles for coordinating the Fall Festival again this year and all of the volunteers who helped and/or provided quilts for the booth. Sherry Behun will no longer be doing the honor quilts and we are in desperate need of a replacement volunteer or committee to handle this important project. She would also like to thank Donna D'Amelio for her service to the guild and that Donna would be stepping aside from her jobs as webmistress, E-tree coordinator, and Newsletter Editor. Linda Odell will be taking over the E-tree and webmistress duties.

ANNOUNCEMENTS:

- Susan Virden presented the monthly minis. Pat Winters provided a framed, vintage quilt block; this was won by Bonnie Dodson. Shirley Nolan donated a witch's hat pin cushion which was won by Rhonda Gianturco. A Pumpkin wall hanging was provided by Mona Hendrickson and won by Pat Winters.
- **Block of the Month:** The block of the month for next month will be the a block named Carrie Nation. The blocks for this month were won by Maggie Wampler.
- **Membership:** Kathy Fowler announced that the membership forms for next year will be available at the November meeting.
- Nancy Shrout announced that UFO #4 is due next month. Projects will be shown and prizes given in December.
- Challenge Quilts were on display and members were invited to vote once for first and second place. Ballots were handed out. The results of the voting were First Place Rhonda Gianturco for her quilt that was pieced and quilted by hand. Second Place was taken by Karen Komatz and Third Place was earned by Yvette Cienski.
- Gala Damato announced that there were 3 Honor Quilts ready for the long arm if anyone was able
 to take any of them. There was a workshop in September and 11 tops were made and others


