Celebrating Thirty Years - A Look Back at Past Presidents - Sandy Barnes

PPQG is celebrating 30 years so we're asking our past presidents to share their memories of when they held office. Sandy Barnes is next.

PPQG has been my home away from home since 1990, when Margaret Wood, our very first Day Chapter Coordinator (but long before the Day Chapter began), talked me into getting into quilting. She drug me to a guild meeting (we were meeting in the Warwick Center Shopping Center in Newport News, in a building that used to be a Church of some sort at the time), and instantly I was hooked. Then however, before Margaret would let me work with a rotary cutter pattern, she "made" me cut out every piece after making a template (are you kidding ?) using scissors to cut the pieces! (What??? I guess that's where I got my love of scissors) Anyway, I wanted to a make a pillow, so she "made" me hand piece every single piece and then hand quilt the entire top! And to this day, I thank her (even though she is no longer with us) every time I work on anything guilt related. Along with all that, I have met soooo many wonderful people/friends - ladies and gentlemen, who have truly changed my life.

At first I didn't volunteer much because I didn't think I knew enough about quilting to contribute anything. But in 1994 I was asked to be the Treasurer and after being "elected" I took over Nancy Garnett's position. It's just gone on from there. I was President from June 1997 to May 1999, at which time I had 2 fantastic boards – 97-98: VP-Alicia Tucker, Ex. 1998-1998 we were fortunate to have VP-Susan Gatewood, Ex. Sec.-Pat Miller, Ex. Treas.-Leslie Sommerlot, Day Co.-Lois Bates, Day Sec.-Connie Lovett, Day Treas.-Madonna Brink, Night Co.- Debbie Moore, Night Sec.-Connie Long, Night Treas.-Terry Grigorian, and Newsletter Editor Cheryl Morris.

I was Day Coordinator til May 2001. Somewhere along the line I was Vice President twice, Natalie and I were the Program Chairs, Susan Kopczyk and I were the Challenge Chairs a couple of times, several times I was the Coordinator for Fall Festival, I was on most all the Quilt Show and Symposium committees in one position or the other, on the Nominating Committee several times, and various other "duties as assigned". I have been given so much from the Guild that I wanted to give back in any way I could. Being involved is not only fun and rewarding, but as I already said, I have the most wonderful friends because of it.

I began the Presidency in 1997 (with approximately 130 members) on the last day of our Quilt Show that year, and ended it a week following Symposium 1999 (with approximately 215 members). I could probably go on for a month, but I believe Donna is already yelling for me to STOP! So, just let me end with this – if you are on the fence about getting involved in guild activities – please get off on our side, you will never regret it.

Honor Quilt Announcements

I hope everyone is having a good week and looking forward to the PPQG celebration tomorrow. Unfortunately, I am unable to attend. So, I want to pass on some information about our Honor Quilts. Some of this was announced at our meetings, however, I know everyone is not able to attend, so bear with me if you have heard the information already.

- Due to low attendance (2 + me) at our last workshop, there will be no additional workshops scheduled until September.
- We have presented 926 quilts to recipients since beginning this project as a guild, 40 since January 2014.
- We have 20 completed quilts on hand ready to be delivered, with 6 more that only need labels.
- We will raffle small items at the PPQG celebration in order to raise funds for the Honor Quilt Project.

The Busy Bee Stitchers will be delivering all quilts on hand to Walter Reed Hospital in Bethesda, MD on May 14th. The reservation for a room at the hospital for the presentation has been confirmed. Consequently, I am asking that anyone who has any quilts that are almost completed try to do so and get them to me prior to that date. If they are turned in to me with labels sewn on already, I have cases made for them, so we would be able to include them in the presentation. I have spoken to the Marine Family Coordinator at Walter Reed and she expressed to me that word is already spreading about our visit, due to the quality of the quilts we delivered there last fall.

Once again, I would like to express my appreciation to all who have been so dedicated to this effort, whether it be cutting, piecing, quilting, or making cases. Our combined efforts are making a difference.

Service Project Update for 2015

PPQG members continue to bring in the bereavement quilts. At the April meetings 35 small quilts were donated. Ten more were sent to Portsmouth Naval Hospital in April. The total delivered so far is 143. We have been asked to make quilts 22 to 24 inch squares for CHKD and Portsmouth NICU. CHKD could also use some regular sized baby quilts for babies that get to go home but that don't have a very good prognosis. For these you could use brighter fabrics and sizes could be 24 to 36 inches. Thank you all for supporting Service Projects and sharing your love of quilting.

NATASHA House still needs 2 bunk bed quilts. Susan Smith made a quilt using the flowers Guild members appliquéd at Joy Duke's program last year. This quilt will be given to NATASHA House possibly for a Raffle Quilt. Quilts as well as pillow cases for all the children and mothers currently living at the house were delivered in March.
