PINS

"Somebody said" I can't wear this pin or that pin this year. I don't know anybody that goes by the name Somebody or Said but the question was posed to me at recent District meetings from a few members. So let's set the record straight and then you can say that "Kim Sloan said...". There is a general matter of protocol regarding the wearing of <u>certain</u> pins - specifically the National or Department Presidents pins and National Recruiter pins. Those should only be worn during that year. So you can wear National President Haake's pin and Department President Eiler's pin until they go out of office. And until National Sr. Vice President Onstwedder and Department Sr. Vice President Judd are elected and installed into their respective offices of President, their pins are not to be worn. The Department Recruiter pins are an ongoing pin that can be worn thru the years even after we discontinue that pin. You earned that pin and those rockers so wear them proudly!

Now let's talk about other pins. Several years ago Past Department President Chrissy Harlan gave a special gift to the Department Line Officers – a pin with a picture of our veteran. That pin was a special gift that may continue to be worn at any time even though it was a gift "her" year.

The "Tear Drop" pin has been available in several different styles from the square design with the eye and the single teardrop, to varying shades of a blue tear drop to include or not include combat boots. That pin was designed and is worn to remind the wearer of the suicide rate among veterans and to bring awareness to the public about this issue. The important thing is to wear the pin that you connect with and that opens communication with those that you meet about the importance of the suicide awareness and the resources available to those in need. I feel a connection to the pin with the eye and the single tear drop so that's the pin I wear. Will I continue to purchase a pin to support whatever program is benefitting from that sale, absolutely. Hope this helps to put that question to head!

Audits and Motions

Over the last several weeks I've talked to several members regarding the reading and acceptance of the Audit Report at the Auxiliary or District meetings and how to properly make the motion to accept that Audit Report. I will now apologize for responding without properly doing the research which I should have done before responding. Previously I had stated that the Trustees were not a committee as they were elected officers and that a motion to approve the audit required a second. I have researched the question and reconsidered the answer.

Research in Robert's Rules of Order showed that a committee may in fact be elected or appointed and there are multiple references to committee reports and actions by those committees. The Bylaws state (Page 89) – The Trustees shall submit and read the written report during an Auxiliary meeting. A Motion to accept the audit is required.

The Ritual (Page 29) shows the Audit Report under Reports of Committees, Standing and Special and states *The Audit Report is called for after each quarterly audit and is the ONLY REPORT accepted by motion.*That would lead you to believe that the Trustees are a committee.

So at the Auxiliary and District meetings, a Trustee could make the following motion – Mr/Madam President, I move on behalf of the Trustees to accept the Audit Report.

No second would be required.

I thought that this month I'd talk about Community Outreach. Community outreach applies to all of the VFW Programs. For us to succeed in helping our Veterans, their families, and our joint communities, we, as individuals and an organization, must work together. Here are some of the outreach ideas I have read and seen. The general public really doesn't understand the needs of Veterans as well as their families. It is our job to focus a spotlight on the shortfalls.

- Tell the public about us. This is a major priority for any organization. Anything looks good on paper but to make the idea work requires the author to be vocal about obstacles This builds supporters. Common ideals and beliefs are the foundation for outreach.
- Success in aiding our military means that we must discuss who we are and why we do what we do. When other organizations understand that we are focused on veterans, it helps to form a common bond. This also helps in educating the public and to remove any misconceptions.
- Form relationships with other groups and organizations. This expands visibility and helps others to see the importance of the idea. If an elected official can see and hear how many agree on the need and the solution, the more likely the issue will be resolved as requested.
- One of the best benefits is recruitment of new members and volunteers. This is vital in avoiding burnout. Sharing the burden helps to retain active, forceful people.

The best way to get the word out is to form a team. After all, outreach works so much better with a blend of skills and talents. Once a need is outlined, then speakers who are comfortable with public speaking need to be found. Someone with super organizational skills help to keep things, like venue, volunteers, publicizing on track. Another person would be someone with research skills. Got to be able to back up the idea with knowledge and information.

Perhaps you feel that Veterans, their families and our communities need to understand the Mission Act, which promises that physician ordered treatment appointments are scheduled within 30 days by the VA Medical staff or it is outsourced to civilian doctors. Very often, VAMC does not have an appropriate number of personnel to accommodate or manage Veteran needs.

Or maybe after seeing the numbers of homeless Veterans, you feel that discharge briefings need to be more in depth with more information for a diversity of adjustments to civilian life. Reintegration can be extremely hard for both the Veteran and the family. Finding a job, a home, establishing friendships, navigating the VA or private system for help with medical and mental issues are just a few of the issues that Veterans face. As the daughter, granddaughter, niece AND wife of a veteran, I have seen the many different aspects of the return to civilian life.

A simple "thank you" can go a long way. Recognizing your members' contributions to your VFW Auxiliary's success is the first step to positive membership retention. Auxiliary members are volunteers who juggle multiple daily responsibilities and still manage to give their time and/or membership dues to support the efforts of the Auxiliary.





Tools such as the Good Job cards or the New Aloha Good Job Award are available on both the national and Arizona website. Another way to recognize the members is thru press releases sent to newspapers when groups of new members join or members help with events either inside or outside of the Post home. Be sure to include photos and names for captions when possible.

Be aware of the struggles of your members and utilize Adopt-A-Member to assist members that are having financial or other issues. Small acts of kindness such as paying annual dues or helping with some meals or transportation for errands can boost a member's mood and make both parties feel amazing.

Organizing a member appreciation event helps your Auxiliary to recognize and thank members who have participated in its activities and events, and championed our organization's mission. For many of our members, family may not be local and the brothers and sisters of the Auxiliary are their "local family". Plan a get together to enjoy each other's company and have some fun.

Find ways to acknowledge special members at the event with Good Job items, Loyalty Certificates for years with the Auxiliary, gift memberships, gifts or prizes. It is important to not only recognize members that excel, but also to highlight members who do nothing more than support the Auxiliary by paying their dues on time and participating on a level that is financially or physically comfortable for them.

3. Take a genuine interest in your mentee as a person.

A mentor/mentee relationship is a very personal one. You can give advice without really knowing a person, but to stand out as an amazing mentor, you're really going to have to get to know

your mentee on a personal level.

You probably have some sort of idea who they are but, what about the stuff that makes them ... them? Getting to know your mentee on a deeper level will help you build a strong relationship, and it'll also help you understand who they are as a person, their likes and dislikes, how they interact with others, and so on.

So, if your menter tells you they had a great weekend, don't just move on with the program. Ask them what they did. One great way to get to know someone. Become an active listener. This is easier said than done: It means making a conscious effort to really, truly pay attention to what your menter is saying.

4. Know when to wait before giving advice.

When you're mentoring someone, you might feel pressured to give them advice straight away. But not all feedback is helpful feedback and giving unhelpful -- or unwelcome -- feedback can be detrimental to your relationship. An amazing mentor knows how to determine whether a situation lends itself to off-the-cuff feedback or thoughtful feedback.

Occasionally, a conversation might catch us off guard. For example, maybe someone raises an issue or a serious problem with an VFW Auxiliary member. Maybe someone says something that makes you mad or upset. If you don't have the right information, experience or emotional state to react to a scenario properly, hit 'pause.' That will give you a chance to think about things and get more information and come back with a clear and valuable response."

What might that look like in a real conversation? "Thanks for sharing this with me. I'm going to take some time and give this some serious thought before we continue. It's important to me that I'm giving you the best possible solution. Why don't we continue talking about it [tomorrow/next week/next time we meet"?

The entries for the Voice of Democracy / Patriot's Pen: "What Makes America Great", should have been collected by the deadline, October 31st. Now the judging begins.

When choosing judges remember:

To include the contest requirements, deadlines and contact information at the time of the judging.

Use an odd number of judges to avoid a tie.

Secure a date and location for the judging.

Avoid using Post or Auxiliary members. Reach out to your community for impartial judges.

<u>Celebrate:</u> Begin planning how you will recognize the students who made your program successful. If possible, invite all participating students. Announce the winners at your event. Consider hosting a luncheon or dinner in their honor. Ask for permission to participate in a school awards forum.

Determine the awards you are offering. The National Organization does not provide guidelines on the amount or kind of award your Post offers; it's up to your Post.

The VFW Store offers several items for <u>Patriot's Pen</u> and <u>Voice of Democracy</u> that would be a great award for local-level participants and winners.

Invite all who helped promote the contests. Include teachers, community leaders, businesses, clergy, and youth group leaders.

Everyone enjoys recognition for a job well done. In addition to honoring the winners, be sure to recognize all students who participated. If they did not place this year, they can enter until they are no longer eligible. Patriot's Pen students finishing eighth grade can advance to the Voice of Democracy Contest in ninth grade.

Share your ideas! Please let me know how you plan to celebrate your students. One Post and Auxiliary presents their awards at a regularly scheduled student assembly. At that time, the students read their essays to those present. This Post chooses to recognize the winning students from that school in this manner for the maximum exposure to other students. This helps promote future contests to the students who are eligible to enter. It has proven to be successful in promoting participation over the years.

For reporting on the yearend report for this scholarship, how was the scholarship promoted ie: distributed applications, publicized/promoted program, at the Family Freedom Festival.
