### **State News Updates**

April 8, 2020

- Governor Cuomo held a press conference at 12:30 AM and provided the following information:
  - o NY Pause and social distancing are working:
    - It has flattened the curve to this point, but need to continue.
    - Number of patients hospitalized is down, including the three-day average.
  - o Building additional capacity worked:
    - Surge and flex helped:
      - 50% additional capacity.
      - Sharing equipment.
    - If the new hospitalizations keep decreasing, the system will stabilize.
  - The curve is flattening because of the actions, but there is no doubt the curve is beginning to bend.
  - Number of deaths may continue to increase as those hospitalized for the longest periods begin to pass away.
    - Total deaths 6,268, up from 5,489, the largest single day increase.
  - The Governor believes there many things to learn:
    - Global pandemics are more likely as the world is smaller.
    - Public health system's capacity and preparedness must be examined.
    - Using technology for the health care system, economy, court system, etc.
    - Testing capacity is still to be developed.
      - It will be a testing-informed process for restarting the economy.
  - SUNY Albany, (Dr. Havidan Rodriguez) and the New York State Department of Health/Northwell Health will be studying why there are more infections and higher morbidity among minority communities.
  - The Governor has directed the State Department of Labor to immediately make \$600 in additional weekly unemployment benefits available to all who filed for unemployment insurance, and to extend the period covered by unemployment insurance by an additional 13 weeks (for a total of 39 weeks).
    - These benefits were included in the Federal CARES Act, but the Governor announced the State began delivering the extra unemployment insurance before federal funds are released to the states.
  - Civic duty to vote should not be opposed to public health.
    - All New Yorkers can vote by absentee on the June 23<sup>rd</sup> primaries (will be done by Executive Order).
  - o Mercury Medical donated 2,400 brand new BiPAP machines.
  - o Will start a social media campaign, "Who are you staying home for?"
- Governor Cuomo publicly released the letter he sent to the New York State Congressional Delegation calling for further federal assistance to help the State respond to the COVID-19 Pandemic

- Important Unemployment Insurance Information
  - New York State Department of Labor <u>Unemployment Assistance Claims Hotline</u> has been extended to seven days a week. Individuals can call the hotline at 1-888-209-8124 during the following hours of operation:
    - Monday Friday: 8:00am 7:30pm.
    - Saturday Sunday: 7:30am 8:00pm.
  - Pandemic Unemployment Assistance was included in the federal CARES Act and expanded eligibility and compensation for unemployed workers.
    - Benefits have been extended for individuals not traditionally covered by unemployment benefits, including self-employed and independent contractors.
    - Individuals in receipt of unemployment benefits will have an additional \$600 added on-top of their regular weekly benefit.
    - Unemployment insurance coverage has been extended for an additional 13 weeks, allowing individuals to now receive benefits for a total of 39 weeks.
  - New York State Department of Labor has partnered with Google to redesign the online unemployment insurance claim user interface. The new website is expected to be rolled out this week.
  - Secretary to the Governor Melissa DeRosa announced that the Department of Labor has increased the number of online servers from four to 50 in an effort to handle the large increase in traffic that has caused the website to crash.
  - Governor Cuomo announced that the Department of Labor has hired an additional 300 staff on top of the 700 staff members that were hired last month - to assist in processing unemployment insurance claims.
