The message of the cross - the message of Jesus - is foolish from the world's perspective, but to those who follow Christ, it is the wisdom and the power of God.

We are the people of the foolish way of Christ. If we follow that way, we may not always understand why it is best - but we will discover that this way is the way of salvation.


Dear Brothers & Sisters: January 14, 2020
