Intensive Care Coordination



Services Include:

- Identify strengths and needs of the child and family
- Identify specific services and supports necessary to meet identified needs
- Link youth and family with appropriate community based services
- Monitor community based services to ensure they are meeting youth and family needs
- Facilitate treatment team meetings that are family driven and youth guided
- Closely collaborate with local Family Assessment and Planning Teams (FAPT)
- Monitor residential treatment providers through on-site visitation and regular contact



Intensive Care Coordination

Welcome to Valley Community Services Board (VCSB). The mission of the Intensive Care Coordination (ICC) program is to facilitate necessary services provided to a youth and his or her family for the purpose of maintaining the youth in, or transitioning the youth to, a family-based or community based setting. We provide services in the areas of Waynesboro, Staunton, and Augusta County.

Intensive Care Coordination (ICC) serves children who are at risk of entering or who are placed in an out of home placement. The purpose is to safely and effectively maintain, transition, or return the child home or to a relative's home, family-like setting, or community at the earliest appropriate time that addresses the child's needs.

Referral Process

Children and adolescents are referred to intensive care coordination services by the local FAPT team. If you have questions about if this service is appropriate for your child, contact the Case Management Supervisor Ginny Bauman at (540)-213-7376.

Criteria

A child is eligible for ICC services if he or she is at risk of an out of home placement, such as foster care, residential placement, juvenile justice placement, etc.
