

****Before you read all the guidelines - please note the following:**

It is our goal to not let these new procedures distract the campers from enjoying every minute they are at Trinity. Let us handle all the new stuff.

We want the children to participate in all those summer camp activities that they wait all year for - stress and worry free - we will make all that handwashing as fun as possible - trust me, I will find a way. Although campers can't be as social with our fellow campers as we usually are - we will be able to socialize with our group and that is certainly a lot more than we have had lately.

Parents - on your child's first day - it has always been nice to walk your child to their group. I don't want to take that away from you - wear a mask and get them settled. Some campers will have an easier time than others; after their first day if you need to help them out of the car, do so, but please stay by car.

*New this year - each group will have their own campsite - a screened gazebo to call home - all right in the heart of camp - more info to follow

The purpose of these guidelines is to make Camp Trinity as safe as possible during these unprecedented times.

CAMP TRINITY COVID-19 GUIDELINES

Our parents and staff will be instrumental in keeping us all healthy this year. In order to do this we are asking that if you have a fever, sore throat, cold, cough, runny nose etc. Please do not come to camp.

1. Outside visitors will not be permitted on camp grounds. This includes parents - parents must remain in the car at all times, when they are picking up or dropping off their child.
2. All activities that intermix campers will not be scheduled; instead each group has their own schedule that they will follow.
3. Trinity will post signs on handwashing and how to stop the Spread of COVID 19 throughout the camp.
4. There will be hand washing stations and hand sanitizer stations throughout the camp.
5. Trinity will post in every email communication, COVID 19 protocols of how to stop the spread.

TRANSPORTATION

- We are asking all parents to take their child's temperature before entering a vehicle. Any child over 100.3 degrees will be required to stay home.
- If you are unable to do this, our driver will take your child's temperature before entering the vehicle.
- Campers will be required to sanitize their hands upon arriving on the van.
- Campers on vans will be required to wear masks. Trinity will supply disposable masks, if you do not have one, but campers are always welcome to use their own.
- All windows will remain down for the duration of the trip on all vehicles
- Upon disembarking, all campers will be required to sanitize their hands again
- Our vans will be sanitized upon arrival to camp and windows will be left down

EXTENDED DAY

- Campers will be broken up into 3 groups based off of age and will be separated into different areas
- All campers will have a temperature check upon arrival. We are asking parents to do this, but we will have thermometers to check as well.
- Campers will be required to sanitize their hands immediately upon arrival and before they leave in the afternoon
- Parents must remain in the car while picking up their child.

PARENT DROP OFF/PICK UP

- Parents may pull into the circle drive and help their children disembark
- Parents are not to come onto camp property
- Children will have temperature check as they arrive and will be required to sanitize their hands upon arrival

STAFF ARRIVAL

- All staff will be required to get a temperature check and sanitize their hands upon arrival. They will wash and sanitize their hands as often or more than the campers. Masks are required when they cannot maintain safe distancing.(6 ft)

GROUPS

- All groups will remain with each other for the entire camp day
- There will be an average of 3 counselors with each group
- The average number of campers in each group at Trinity - 8 -15

ACTIVITIES

- Previously craft and cooking were indoors - they will now be held on one of our spacious patios or a covered tent outside.
- All activities will have hand sanitizer/hand washing readily available. Campers will be required to sanitize either when they leave the activity or arrive at the next one.
- All specialists (Craft, Archery, Fishing, Boating, Swim Instruction, Book Club, Cooking) will sanitize their equipment between the groups arriving
- Each group will have their own equipment bag with sports equipment only they will use - equipment will be wiped down and sanitized after each activity

LUNCH

- There will be 2 lunches this season. All groups will eat outside on picnic tables or any of the boulders. Same as previous years
- All staff and campers will be required to wash their hands before eating lunch.
- All ordered lunches will be served in either disposable throwaway containers or individually wrapped in aluminum foil (same as previous years)
- All servers will wear both masks and gloves
- Condiments, dressing, syrup etc, will be served in single use containers
- All drinks will be individual containers (no big containers of juice)
- Staff will eat outside with their group
- Any campers who order lunch will have it delivered to them outside

SWIM

- Swim instruction and free swim will be offered daily
- Pools will be divided up for free swim so that groups do not interact with one another
- Lifeguards will be required to wear masks when they are not able to socially distance while teaching swim
- Campers will be separated based off of ability level in their group only. There will be no mixing between groups
- Staff will be required to wear masks when social distancing is made impossible (helping in bathroom, sun tan lotion, etc)
- When social distancing of at least 6 feet can be maintained, masks will not be required to be worn

If Someone is suspected of COVID-19

- Communicate that staff or children should not come to camp, and that they should notify camp officials if they show symptoms of, test positive for, or have been exposed to someone with COVID-19.
- Immediately separate staff and campers with COVID-19 symptoms at camp. Individuals who are sick should go home and or to a healthcare facility depending on how severe their symptoms are.
- Anyone showing symptoms will be isolated in a separate room in the main office. Parents will be called to transport home immediately.
- Close off areas used by a sick person and do not use these areas until after cleaning and disinfecting them (for outdoor areas, this includes surfaces or shared objects in the area).
- Wait at least 24 hours before cleaning and disinfecting. If 24 hours is not feasible, wait as long as possible.
- Camp administrators will notify local health officials, staff, and families immediately of any case of COVID-19 while maintaining confidentiality.
- Advise those who have had close contact with a person diagnosed with COVID-19 to stay home and self-monitor for symptoms. Those campers and staff may return when cleared by a doctor or another qualified health professional.
