

LANCASTER EVENT CENTER (Lincoln, Nebraska)



The campground is east of Pavilion III and features electrical hookups.



The Amy Countryman Arena, where the main classes would be held, is 300 feet long by 125 feet wide. The east side of the arena has 40 stalls on dirt.

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The arena was designed by Bob Kiser and is maintained with Kiser equipment. The building features energy-efficient Thermo cyclers for heat, extra bright energy-efficient lighting, huge overhead door with 5 smaller overhead doors, and 18 smaller overhead doors for air flow in the summer.



The main warmup area is on the south end of Amy's.



The west side of the arena features more than 20,000 square feet of concrete for a trade area or portable seating.



There is paved parking for 4,000 vehicles.



Pavilion II is configured to hold 250 stalls with an indoor warm-up arena. By taking out the arena, it can hold up to 400 stalls. There are wash bays in all four corners. Almost all stalls are on dirt.



The Multi-Purpose Arena features a 100 x 225 arena and it would be used as a warm-up/lunging area.

Pavilion I has 60,000 square foot of concrete surface, with a center area made up of dirt for use as an arena. It can be used as overflow for stalls. However, they would be on concrete



Pavilion III has an arena that is 220 x 114, with complete set up for cattle classes/rodeo on the south side. The north side holds up to 50 stalls on dirt. There is an outdoor arena near Pavilion III.

There are numerous hotels and restaurants within 3-4 miles of the facility. A Wal-Mart is located next door.
