There is a calendar available to participate in daily activities. This is an opportunity to take on a spiritual discipline rather than the more customary activity of giving up something for Lent. Bishop Andrew will be hosting a conversation about the signs in different locations in the Diocese. A schedule has been included in this newsletter.

Participating in Lent is an opportunity for everyone. Even if you cannot come out to a group or to church on Sunday, you can join others through the website, Signsoflife.org, with no expense. For those unable to go online, I will provide weekly booklets. Please let the office know and I will gladly mail them out if you cannot come in person.

Lent is a season that invites us into contemplation. As we pray and notice the signs of life, the Spirit of God will be apparent around us, others and the wider community and world. As St. Peter's, St. Ninian's, and St. John the Divine move closer to amalgamation, we all need to be praying for discernment. After the service, we had Coffee Hour and a time to greet our Bishop.









Steering Committee Update

The Webster's dictionary meaning for steering committee is and I quote "a committee that decides on the priorities or order of business of an organization and manages the general course of its operation." In November 2019, The Diocese of Toronto, under the direction of our Bishop, The Right Reverend Andrew Asbil and supervised by Janet Marshall, director of Congregational Development, a steering committee was to be formed for the purpose of amalgamation of the three parishes of St. Peter's, St. Ninian's and St. John the Divine. All three parishes are struggling to meet the needs of the community. The steering committee would be made of three to four parishioners from each of the three parishes. The purpose of this committee was to create a stronger ministry and mission for Central Scarborough. The representatives for St. Peter's are: Gloria Ramsay Hall, Michael Barrow, Lottie Bowring, Jane Lawrence, and Lisa Turner with alternate Nancy Wilson. The committee is meeting on a monthly basis and through congenial dialogue working together to "Recreate God's Church". There is a very long and thorough process that must be followed to have a 100% congenial amalgamation. At our initial meeting, November 16th, 2019, it was agreed that we needed to involve as many members of our congregations as possible. It was decided that we would have a Visionary Meeting to reach this objective.

To involve as many of our congregational members, a Visionary Meeting was held on January 4th, 2020. This was an open meeting to all three congregations to discuss the following six topics: Worship & Music; Children & Family; Youth; Outreach; Pastoral Care; Senior Ministry. Each parishioner attended two of the topics to share their thoughts on the strengths and goals for each of these. This was a well-attended event by all parishes, with approximately 30 parishioners from St. Peter's. The discussions revealed a common value that the Church is a place that supports the community through programs and fellowship. It was also agreed that through different types of worship, music and prayers the needs of the people can experience God. Through this amalgamation, we will be stronger to support the ministries, under the leadership of a full time priest, now and in the future.

The main question on everyone's mind is WHERE will we worship?? To achieve this answer, an appraisal of all three properties must be done. An architect, Peter Tovell, has been hired by the Diocese to assess and appraise all three churches and rectories. This will be done over the following two to three weeks. We hope to have a written report available by the end of March. A timeline of amalgamation will be more feasible after the assessments are done. Money has already been approved by the Diocese for any renovations that must be made to accommodate everyone. There are several possible ideas for the proprieties, to meet the needs of the community, but until the appraisals are in, no definite plans can be proposed. Once in place, there will be a town hall meeting held at each church to review and approve the plans. In the meantime, Janet Marshall has given us homework to do. We are to do an inventory of all items each of the church owns. I.e., vestments, prayer books, hymnals, memorial donations, hangings, banners, etc. Jaime Barrow, from St. Peter's, has already begun to do this for us.

As we see other denominations, either growing or closing, the Anglican Church has the strongest immigration to Canada. With a strong, positive amalgamation, we will be able to meet the health and wellness of ALL God's PEOPLE!! We will also have a new name for the church. Suggested names can be submitted to the Bishop. Remember, it is the not the building that makes the Church but rather the PEOPLE!! The PEOPLE are the CHURCH!! In FAITH, let us RENEW and RECREATE a CHURCH of the PEOPLE!!



We have two Sunday services:




