

us about true love. While many passages give us an idea of what true love really is. Still the clearest concise depiction of love is found in 1 Corinthians 13. This passage is often included is some fashion as part of wedding ceremonies. (Quoted from the Message) v4-8a, 13:

"Love never gives up.

Love cares more for others than for self.

Love doesn't want what it doesn't have.

Love doesn't strut,

Doesn't have a swelled head.

Doesn't force itself on others,

Isn't always "me first,"

Doesn't fly off the handle,

Doesn't keep score of the sins of others.

Doesn't revel when others grovel,

Takes pleasure in the flowering of truth,

Puts up with anything,

Trusts God always,

Always looks for the best,

Never looks back,

But keeps going to the end.

Love never dies.

But for right now, until that completeness, we have three things to do to lead us toward that consummation: Trust steadily in God, hope unswervingly, love extravagantly. And the best of the three is love."

The ultimate example of love is how God demonstrated His love for us through sending Jesus Christ. Romans 5:8 "but God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us." If we were to research each of the points mentioned above in 1 Corinthians 13, we see that Jesus Christ is the personification of true unselfish love. For example: Paul wrote that love does not keep track of the sins of others, Jeremiah 13:14 "For I will forgive their iniquity, and I will remember their sin no more." and in Hebrews 10:17 "I will remember their sins and their lawless deeds no more." We could demonstrate more, but most of us a smart enough to connect the dots.

We are called to be imitators of Jesus Christ. The word Christian was originated as meaning followers of Christ we're called little Christs. In several places Paul tells believers to imitate Christ. How well do we love? Do we love like Jesus? Does our family, coworkers, friends and community see us loving like Christ? What areas do we need to improve. The passage in 1 Corinthians is just a starting point. In the year to come, can we set as a goal to love more, to love purer?



This tasty treat doubles as a game to play with a buddy.




What you need:

Pat Answers

Does Jesus have to Convince God the Father to Love Us?

There is a warped view of the Trinity and God the Father which pictures Him as full of anger, wanting to fully vent His anger on us sinners, but Jesus keeps stopping the Father from punishing us. I am ashamed to admit I held this view myself as a young man. I thought the Father was never really pleased with me and that if it was not for Jesus stepping in again and again that I would be "toast."

This view of God is patently false! Not only does the Trinity work in harmony and unity to accomplish our salvation from start to finish (see Ephesians 1:3-14), but the Bible declares repeatedly that our salvation is rooted in God the Father's great love! Take the obvious John 3:16 - "For GOD so loved the world that He gave His only Son..." This is further developed in 1 John 4:9,10, 14 - "In this the love of God was made manifest among us, that God sent His only Son into the world, so that we might live through Him. In this is love, not that we loved God but that He loved us and sent His Son to be the propitiation for our sins...and we have seen and testify that the Father sent His Son to be the Savior of the world." Our salvation is all because of the Father's great love - Ephesians 2:4. It is wrong to think Jesus has to persuade the Father to love and forgive us when it was the Father's plan all along!

The reality is that the Father loved us so much that He poured out His holy anger and wrath fully on His own Son, Jesus at the cross - see 2 Corinthians 5:21 and Romans 3:24- 26. God made Jesus our substitute for His glory and for love's sake. This is the eternal love story and covenant between God the Father and God the Son - see John 17. The Father accepts all who are in Christ, linked to Christ by faith, and graciously counts as righteous - as holy as His own Son. God the Father's love is poured out on us in Christ now through the Holy Spirit - Romans 5:6. "There is no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus." - Romans 8:1. We are now in and through faith in Christ the apple of His eye, His precious children, His beloved ones, and no one can stand against us, condemn us, or separate us from His love - see Romans 8:31-39. Even on the darkest days and in the toughest times, let us remember God the Father's love is the basis of our hope and life in Christ!

May you savor God's love afresh and may it lead you to surrender yourself to live day by day for His honor because He is your loving Father. In our Father's amazing love,
