
We embrace the involvement of patients and their families in decision making and participation in hands on care. Individual needs and choices are recognized and included. We are partners together with you in your care.

Those referred or who have family history of genetic problems can meet with our genetic counsellors at LHO.


LHO offers a series of 4 birthing classes offered by certified Lamaze childbirth instructors.

#### P.A.R.E.N.T. CLASSES

A 3-hour class for the pregnant woman and her partner to focus on care of the infant and mother following birth.

#### KANGAROO KAPERS

A teaching program for preschoolers to introduce the new baby.



- Support from family and friends during labour and birth.
- Labour, birth and recovery is usually arranged in the same room.

#### MOTHER BABY UNIT

- Moms and babies stay together There are extended visiting hours for dad.
- Learn how to care for your new baby.
- Build your confidence and understanding of your baby before you go home.

ADVANCED LEVEL II REGIONAL NEONATAL INTENSIVE CARE UNIT If your baby is sick or premature, we have a Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) with a healthcare team to care for your baby.

#### SELF CARE UNIT

A bed may be available for mothers who have been discharged but still have their baby in NICU.

#### BABY 1D

Babies born at LHO receive a "passport" to security immediately after they are born.

The passport contains: Foot prints and details about the baby's weight, hair colour, eye colour and additional security information.

PEDIATRIC UNIT/REGIONAL CHILDRENS HEALTH CENTRE If your baby/child becomes sick after discharge from the hospital, we have a Pediatric Unit with a health care team experienced in the care of children.

BREASTFEEDING CLINIC/SUPPORT GROUP Lactation consultants to assist and encourage with breastfeeding issues before and after birth.
