Water aerobics will start March 10th from 5:30 A.M. to 6:30 A.M. Swim team practice starts March 17th will run Tuesday to Thursday from 4 to 5 P.M. Pool will not open to

the public until staffed and we have two applicants. Got the grader up and running. Working on getting someone to come in and teach our guys how to run the grader. Project going on the north end of the softball field, putting in two t-ball fields. Anna is working on getting the pool paint resurfaced. Submitting to insurance for the fencing at the tennis ball fields. Discussing on how to keep the kids involved looking at adding a basketball court over by the skate park for capital outlay. Coming upon 10-year window on capital outlay funds and talking about adding on above the cardio room as that is unused empty space.

Barber asked if the wastewater tech able to sample the effluent coming out of the RV park. Olmedo explains that everything over there is connected as it ties into the main line. Hansen mentioned brainstorming how to test the effluent as it's not a constant flow.
