## "The Almighty has done great things for me"

Elizabeth described Mary as "the most blessed" of all women. She was "blessed" not only because God had chosen her, but also because Mary believed that the promise made to her by God would be fulfilled. This promise, that Mary would give birth to God's Son, was the prelude to another promise: Jesus' promise that whoever lives and believes in him shall not die, but have eternal life. This promise is for everyone, for all of us.

Mary's Assumption – her being taken up, body and soul, into heavenly glory – is really a feast that flows out of Easter. <u>It is her feast, but it's also our feast</u>. It's a celebration in the life of Mary of what the resurrection ultimately means for us – fullness of life with Jesus in heaven.

## PLEASE BE AWARE

<u>It is essential</u> to be at the church <u>15 minutes</u> before mass starts, so that a steward can show you where to sit.

<u>Please enter</u> the church in the normal way and <u>exit</u> through the double doors at the rear of the church.

<u>Important</u>: Please <u>sanitise</u> your hands on entry into the church. Refrain from touching anything in the porch.

There will be no missals or hymn books and therefore no congregational singing during mass.

There will be no sign of peace.

**Kneelers** in the pews should not be used.

<u>Receiving Communion:</u> Please remain seated until directed by a steward to proceed. <u>Communion</u> can only be taken in the hand with your arms outstretched to the full so that there is the required distance between you and the priest.

<u>Important</u>: <u>At Communion</u> after the response: 'Lord I am not worthy....' the priest will hold up the Host to the congregation and say "THE BODY OF CHRIST" to which the people respond "AMEN". In the same way the people say "AMEN" after he has elevated the Chalice. This enables the people's Communion to be distributed in silence with no dialogue, as they have already acclaimed the presence of the Lord.

<u>There</u> will be <u>collection baskets</u> for Offertory Collection at the entrance and exit from the church.

<u>Please</u> disperse as quickly as possible after mass.

Those attending Mass/ Services in Churches should limit their interactions with anyone they are not attending church with, i.e. if they are attending corporate worship with one other household, wherever possible they should maintain social distancing with anyone outside of this group.

FACE MASKS are now compulsory in churches and places of worship.

Face coverings are to be worn in enclosed public spaces at all times.

They are also currently mandatory on public transport and shops and in supermarkets.





Prayer of St. Bernard of Clairvaux

St. Bernard (1090-1153) was born near Dijon and died in Clairvaux, France. He was of a noble family and received a careful education in his youth. With his father, brother and thirty noblemen he entered the Benedictine monastery of Citeaux. Two years later he led a group of monks to establish a house at Clairvaux, and became its abbot. The monastic rule which he perfected at Clairvaux became the model for 163 monasteries of the Cistercian reform. He was a theologian, poet, orator, and writer. He is sometimes considered as a Father of the Church.
