ROYAL FOOD CORNER

NKWOBÌ

Nkwobi is a Nigerian delicacy. It is cooked cow foot mixed in spicy palm oil paste. It is often mistaken for Isi Ewu but they are not the same. Cow foot is quite tough so if you have a pressure cooker, do use it for cooking it to save time, gas or electricity. It is best served and presentable in a wooden mortar as shown in the image below.

Ingredients for 5 people:



8 pounds of cow foot (cut into sizeable pieces)

300ml Palm Oil

1 tablespoon powdered edible potash (Akanwu)

1 teaspoon ground Ehu seeds

2 tablespoons ground crayfish

3 habanero peppers (or to your taste)

2 medium onion

3 big stock cubes

Salt (to taste)

Garnish with 2 medium onion and 10 Utazi leaves

Preparation:

- Cut the cow foot into medium chunks.
- Put the powdered potash into a bowl.
- Add a small quantity of water (about 6 tablespoons) and stir well.
- Pass it through a fine sieve and set the liquid aside.
- Cut 2 onions into 8 big chunks.
- Pound the pepper with a mortar and pestle or cut into small cubes.
- Grind the crayfish.
- Crack and remove the outer shell of the Ehu then grind with a dry mill or coffee grinder.
- Wash and put the cow foot chunks in a pot.
- Add the stock cubes (crushed) and the chunks of onion.
- Add a small quantity of water and start cooking at medium heat till well cooked.
- Add just enough water to prevent burning as you cook. There should not be any stock (water) in the pot when the meat is done.
- While the meat is cooking, pour the palm oil into a clean dry pot.
- Pour in the potash mixture (sieved) into the oil.
- Stir with a wooden spatula as you pour the potash. You will notice the palm oil begin to curdle and turn yellow.
- Keep stirring till all the oil has turned yellow.
- Add the ground crayfish, pepper and Ehu seeds. Stir very well till they are all incorporated.
- When the meat is done, add salt, stir and cook till all the water has dried.
- Add cooked cow foot to the palm oil paste and stir very well with the wooden spatula.
- Put it back on the stove and heat till the Nkwobi is piping hot, stirring all the time to make sure it does not burn.
- To prepare the garnish, cut the onions into rings and cut the utazi into long thin slices.
- Add the thin slices of utazi and onion rings on top of it.
- Best served with chilled drinks.

SHORT SERMON

THE REWARD OF GIVING

Giving is an act of donating, contributing, and transferring something that is in your possession voluntarily for a purpose. It can be material things, time, cash, food, services and others.

To every believer of the word of God, one thing that is very important is the efficacy of His word. Psalm 138:2 stated that *“I will worship toward thy holy temple and praise thy name for thy lovingkindness and for thy truth: **for thou hast magnified thy word above all thy name**”* The word of God in the area of giving cannot



be compromised. Especially, to someone who desires to have abundant life. The word of God encourages us to give. **Luke 6: 38 KJV:** *“Give, and it shall be given unto you; good measure, pressed down, and shaken together, and running over, shall men give into your bosom. For with the same measure that ye mete withal it shall be measured to you again”* In other words, there are rewards to every sincere giver; who gives with a cheerful heart not with grudge or under compulsion. 2 Corinthian 9:7 says *“Each of you should give what you have decided in your heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver”*

One amazing thing is that, reward can be measured. According to **2 Corinthian 9: 6 (NIV)** *“Remember this: Whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows generously will also reap generously”*. That means, how much you give determines the size of

your reward. However, everyone has something to give no matter the quantity. The story of the widow at Zarephath in 1 Kings 17:7-16 tells us that, when she gives her little, she had to prophet Elijah, her story changed, she had more than enough. God asks Abraham to sacrifice his son, Isaac which he obeyed. God fulfilled his purpose in the life of Abraham. Adam and Eve disobeyed God. They were driven away from the Garden of Eden, but God reconciled with humanity by the giving of our Lord Jesus Christ (John 3:16).

What can you give and who should you give to? Giving is a serious issue among Christians today. The Bible made it clear what to give and who should receive it. Matthew 25: 35-36 NIV stated that *“For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in, ³⁶I needed clothes and you clothed me, I was sick and you looked after me, I was in prison and you came to visit me”* The Lord is saying we should give food to the hungry, drink to the thirsty. To the naked or those that have no clothing we should cloth them. For the sick, care for them, help them get well. We are also not to neglect the prisoners; we should care for their soul and physical needs.

The word of God encourages to give to men of God, pastors, apostles, prophets, etc. The word of God confirmed this in Matthew 10: 41 that *“Whoever welcomes a prophet as a prophet will receive a prophet’s reward, and whoever welcomes a righteous person as a righteous person will receive a righteous person’s reward”*. We are also required to give to the service of the Lord; and God said to us that we will get a hundredfold in return. Apostle Peter said to Jesus in Mark 10, 28-30 NKJV *“Then Peter began to say to Him, “See, we have left all and followed you”. So Jesus answered and said, “Assuredly, I say to you, there is no one who has left house or brothers or sisters or father or mother or wife or children or lands, for my sake and the gospel who shall not receive a hundredfold now in this time—houses and brothers and sisters and mothers and children and lands, with persecutions—and in the age to come, eternal life”* in other words, to every service you give there is a hundredfold reward.

In conclusion, there are rewards to every giving that is done with a cheerful heart. According to 2 Corinthians 9 :8, *“And God is able to make all grace abound to you, so that in all things at all times, having everything that you need, you will abound in every good work.”* Dear beloved, *remember this: Whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows generously will also reap generously. Each of you should give what you have decided in your heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. God is able, He will bless you abundantly. As it is written: “They have freely scattered their gifts to the poor; their righteousness endures forever”* (2 Corinthian 9: 6-9 NIV).

THE POWER OF QUALITY SLEEP

“Sleep plays a vital role in good health and well-being throughout life. Getting enough quality sleep at the right times



can help protect your mental health, physical health, quality of life, and safety. During sleep, your body is working to support healthy brain function and maintain your physical health” (NIH 2019).

Quality of sleep are centered around how many hours a person clocks each night. Psychologist Michael Grandner, PhD, Director of the Sleep and Health Research Program at University of Arizona clearly stated, “fifty years of data show that people who sleep between seven and eight hours live the longest.”

Lack of sleep can damage brain, working memory, reaction time and wreak havoc on your mind. Researcher Holtzman recruited participants to spend a night in the lab and disrupted the sleep of half the participant with series of loud beeps each time they sank into slow-wave sleep. The next day, he found those who had disrupted sleep had 10 percent higher level of beta-amyloid protein in fluid surrounding their brains and spinal cords (Brain, Vol. 140, No 8, 2017).

Beta-amyloid protein is a waste product found in fluids surrounding the brain. Research from Maiken Nedergaard, MD, at the University of Rochester discovered that deep sleep causes glial cells in the brain to shrink. That, in turn, opens pathways for fluid exchange that flushes away waste products such as beta-amyloid (Science, Vol 342, No 6156, 2013). Sleep is part of the plumbing system of the brain.

To improve your sleep habits, practice the followings:

- Go to bed and wake up at the same time every day. For children, have a set bedtime and a bedtime routine. Don't use the child's bedroom for timeouts or punishment.
- Try to keep the same sleep schedule on weeknights and weekends. Limit the difference to no more than about an hour. Staying up late and sleeping late on weekends can disrupt your body clock's sleep.
- Use the hour before bed for quiet time. Avoid strenuous exercise and bright artificial light, such as from a TV or computer screen. The light may signal the brain that it's time to be awake.
- Avoid heavy and large meals within a couple hours of bedtime. (Having a light snack is okay.) Also, avoid alcoholic drinks before bed.
- Avoid nicotine (for example, cigarettes) and caffeine (including caffeinated soda, coffee, tea, and chocolate). Nicotine and caffeine are stimulants, and both substances can interfere with sleep. The effects of caffeine can last as long as 8 hours. So, a cup of coffee in the late afternoon can make it hard for you to fall asleep at night.
- Spend time outside every day (when possible) and be physically active.
- Keep your bedroom quiet, cool, and dark (a dim night light is fine, if needed).
- Take a hot bath or use relaxation techniques before bed (NIH 2019).

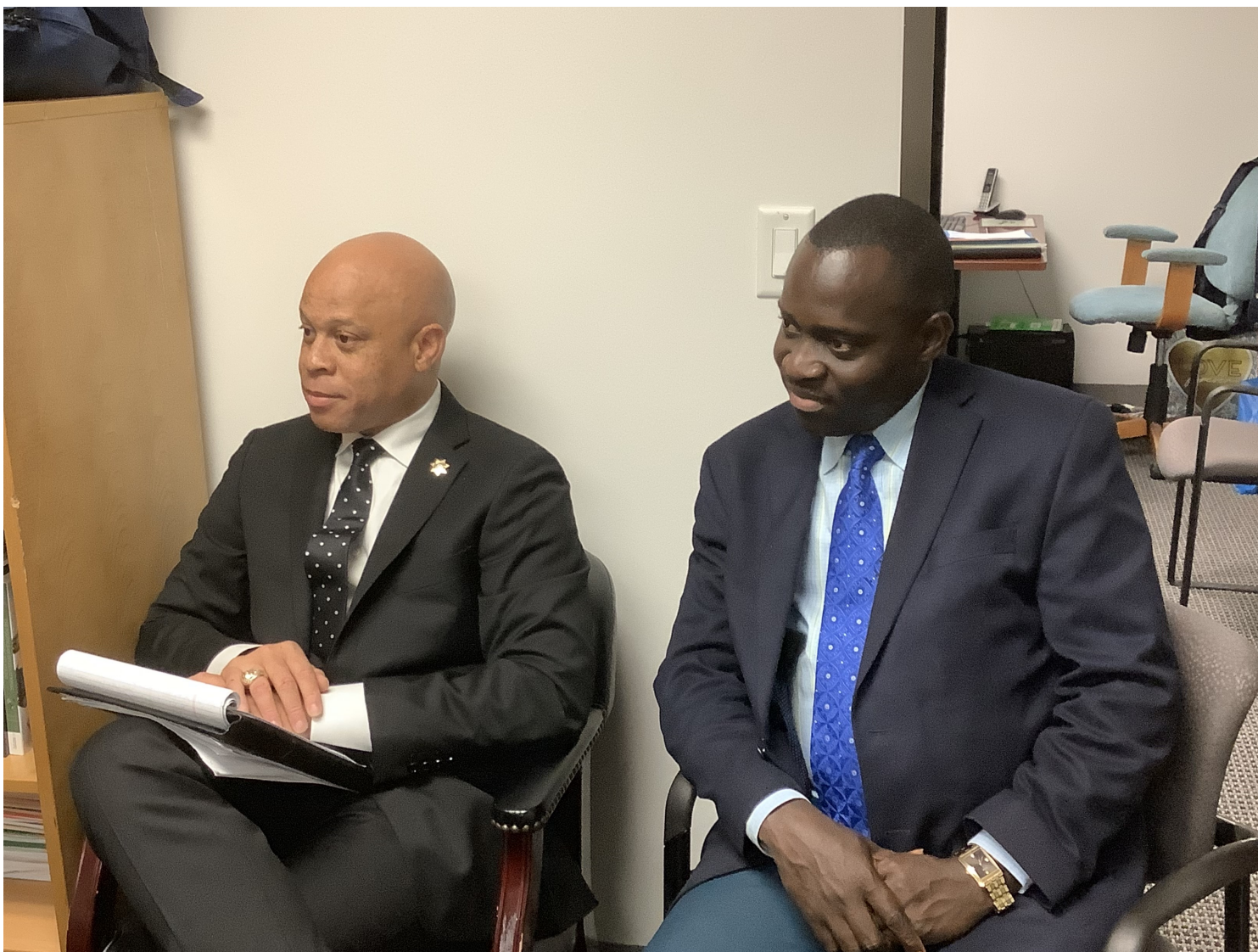

The unconventional approach to recruitment, education, communication, and job

She was able to find and work in partnership with the DORS program and later with the VA program. In the program,

inmates released from State and Federal prisons are taught how to drive 18 wheelers. After obtaining their CDL licenses, they are placed in jobs within 5 to 10 days. This helps to reduce the high rate of recidivism, or going back to prison/jail, by giving them skills to enable them work after release.

She also works with the Texas Workforce re-entry program through partnership with SER-Jobs of Houston, a non-profit organization. Her trucking company supports other non-profit

and granted his custody to the grandmother, who lived in Galveston.

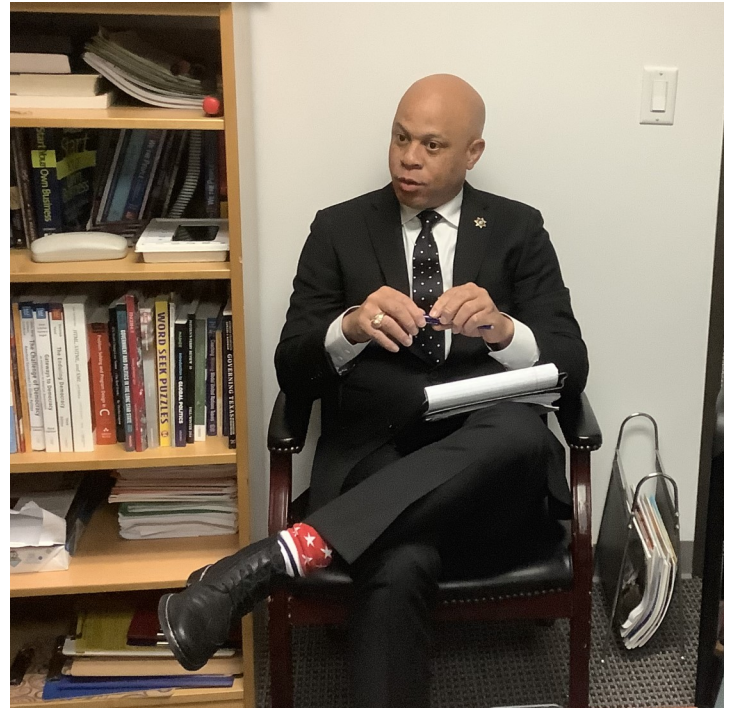

because this kid could be somebody. This kid could be a lawyer". Though he didn't know what a lawyer was, yet he was a part of the discussion which transferred the responsibility of his up-bringing to his uncle. His uncle adopted him and did a remarkable job in his upbringing, before he passed away. He



He emphasized that he wants to be a Sheriff because he believes that he has the skills, knowledge and experience. He had been a police officer over 21 years. He catalogued that he started from a regular reserve police officer as a volunteer, then he was promoted to a full-time employee and based on



reminded that his uncle was his father in every respect and confirmed that everything he has become was a direct result of his uncle.

Regarding his service to humanity, he informed that his uncle worked with the Sheikh Community Center, the Lord Parker, for 15 years before he developed his own Community enrichment center called Seha Youth Program. He was a co-founder and Board member of the program for 25 years. The program includes a community summer enrichment program which provides youths like he was, a place to go in the summer after school. He lectured that his father taught him how to effect change by electing people, who have shared orientations, into positions to effect changes from the inside. He decided to become a lawyer to complement the African American lawyers, who cater to the African American community. That meant that he needed to have some academic credibility, he added.

the development of his education and work practicality he became a sergeant, a lieutenant, a captain, a chief of police and an assistant chief deputy of police.

On the slogan "the needs of Community changes everything", he chipped that "you cannot give a generic solution to a problem that is more integrated or complex than what you think it is. It needs to be a tailored specific design to resolve or ameliorate the problems of your community. But you cannot do that if you don't have the tools or the resources to do that". He explained that he was referring to the social tools, the intellectual tools, the cultural tools, and the diversity orientation needed to get it done.
