Opened January 25th after 8 years of delays

Ribbon cutting for the long awaited Eugene VA Healthcare Center took place on Saturday January 16th.

The by invitation event was attended by Veteran leaders, VA staff and politicians. The speakers included US Senator Ron Wyden, and Congressman Peter DeFazio. Oregon's 4th District Congressman Peter DeFazio was praised by Mr. Terry Moreland the chief architect of the project and keynote speaker at the event. Mr. Moreland sited the many times Congressman DeFazio had to intervene over many years, and never gave up. Peter DeFazio got a standing ovation for his work to secure the new Center for Veterans.

During Senator Wyden's speech, the senior Senator from Oregon cited that Veterans will no longer have to travel up or down Interstate 5 for their healthcare. He was referring to Veterans in Lane and other counties in the VA Roseburg catchment area who drive to Roseburg for their VA healthcare.

With Veterans in counties north using the new 126,000 square foot center, VA Roseburg Healthcare System Director Doug Paxton told an audience at the last Town Hall that VA Roseburg will see a 40% reduction in patients. This potentially will be a win for those who use VA Roseburg for their healthcare.

Before the ribbon cutting event I was given a tour of the state-of-the-art Healthcare center by VA Roseburg's Public Information Director Shawn Clark. What I saw was an impressive array of specialties that included vision, hearing, dental, mental health, Women's health, gastroenterology, orthopedic, rehabilitation, along with Primary Care. The outpatient surgery pre and post-op area, with all the bells and whistles, surgery rooms, sterilization, and physicians private locker area was indeed a sight to see.

The Center also has C&P exam rooms, and an area

with two large conference rooms. Shawn Clark told me that those rooms can be used for the Lane County Town Halls, or other events.


One thing that struck me was that the Physical Therapy unit at the new Center is located on the ground floor corner of the building with glass windows letting in lots of light. It is a lot different from the dark, no windows PT unit in Roseburg.

If some of us end up having to travel to the new Center for specialty care, it will sure beat having to drive to the Portland VA Medical Center.

were standing around if the Post would be interested in some of their grandfathers American Le-


gion memorabilia. The answer was yes, and we thanked the Wilber family for keeping these pieces of early American Legion History alive.

One of the American Legion Delegate ribbons is dated September 17-18 1919, comes after the American Legion got its Congressional Charter on March 16, 1919. This ribbon is from Department of Oregon's first Convention.

Korean War Veterans Honored

Purple Heart Trail Completed

The dual signs Honoring Korean War Veterans and Purple Heart recipients are seen in the attached photo that was dedicated January 12, 2016 by the Purple Heart Organization at the Juanita Pohl Center in Tualatin, Oregon to honor the memories and the sacrifices of the men and women that served our country during the Korean War.

The signs were in place at the intersections of Interstate 5 and Hwy 205 South bound on January 13, 2016, by the Oregon Department of Transportation (ODOT) There is also a sign placed on I-5 outside the City of Medford designating the Purple Heart Trail. These signs will now complete the I-5 corridor that runs from the border of Canada to the border of Mexico. The Interstate 5 posting is the only International Purple Heart Trail anywhere.

There are 3 Oregon Korean War Memorials, one at the Willamette National Cemetery, on the Capitol grounds in Salem, and in the Town Center Park in Wilsonville.
