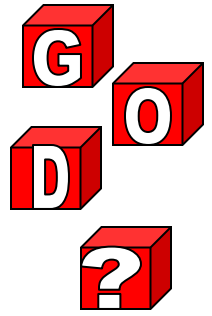

Mission Minders September 2016

The work of the Ben Salem Mission Committee continues, and it is only through your help and donations, that we continue to assist others in need. Recently, we donated \$400 to the **Domestic Violence Center** of Carbon and Luzerne counties to support their efforts of helping those in need of shelter and other necessary resources. We also donated \$200 to Alex's Lemonade Stand as part of the Youth Group's mission to help children with cancer, and \$200 toward Samantha Zipp's trip back to Manila where she will do missionary work with Action International Ministries. Our third quarter mission, **Martin's Flu Foundation**, a foundation initiated by Pastor Mike and his wife, Diane, after their son, Martin, died of complications resulting from the flu, is doing well and we ask that you remember to donate to this cause through the end of September.

The **Walk, Run, and Cycle Exercise Challenge** will end on September 3rd. Hopefully, many of you tracked your exercise routines this summer so that the Mission Committee can reward these efforts by donating 50 cents for every mile walked; 25cents for every mile ran, and 10 cents for every mile cycled. Depending on the amounts tallied, the committee will donate to one or more local/regional charities that benefit local sport teams.

Recently, the committee funded \$1,475 from **KIVA** donations and matching undesignated funds to 4 recipients who requested loans for schooling, farm equipment, farm supplies, other items needed to sustain businesses. These loans will be paid back over the next 24 months and will then be available to be redistributed to other recipients.

Looking ahead, Ben Salem will host the **Feed a Neighbor meal at Zion's UCC on Thursday, November 17th.** We host this dinner twice per year, and serve approximately 100 people each time. This is a good way to help others in need, and to realize how we and our families receive so many blessings as we learn to serve others. 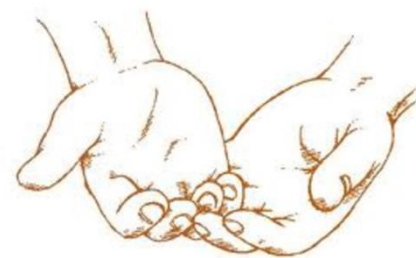

Being the “Hand of God”



Proverbs 3:27 – Do not withhold good from those to whom it is due, when it is in your power to act (NIV).

Wouldn't it be nice if we could help everyone in need? For obvious reasons, that is simply impossible. However, the Bible instructs us that having a little more than those around us carries responsibility (I Timothy 6:17-18). We are expected to be generous and willing to share! This means that when God places someone in our path with a legitimate need, that we are to help them. Your hand is God's hand for that person.
