God gave us "Free will" and expects us to use it to serve Him. It is our will that makes us unique to all God's creatures. Animals live on instinct, however, God gave us the ability to make decisions based on reasoning. Genesis 2:16-17 (ESV) says "And the Lord God commanded the man, saying, "You may surely eat of every tree of the garden, but of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil you shall not eat, for in the day that you eat of it you shall surely die."" Because they chose to disobey God, we now are living the consequences of their decision. Who is living according to the decision you made?

- Luke 22:42 (NASB) 42 saying, "Father, if You are willing, remove this cup from Me; yet not My will, but Yours be done."
- John 6:38 (NASB) 38 For I have come down from heaven, not to do My own will, but the will of Him who sent Me.
