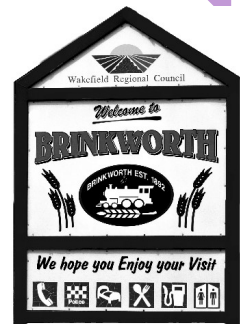

I hope everybody is coping well post COVID-19 lockdowns, although the situation still largely remains. As restrictions slowly wind down, I think many will be facing daily life with a new appreciation of how lucky we really are.

Generally speaking the impact on local Policing has been from checking on those required to isolate, or conducting duties at border checkpoints as resources are shuffled to staff.

In terms of crime recently, there have been thefts of chemicals at Hart on two occasions, sheep theft at Yacka and further afield the Lochiel Tennis Club was broken into, a reminder that some don't shut down their chosen operations when the rest of the world does. Continue to report any suspicious activity to Police or Crime Stoppers. If you've been thinking about upgrading your security or installing cameras, I wouldn't discourage you, particularly if not within the township.

As far as making contact with me personally, the phone may at times be diverted. This is a tool to manage the Police response, part of Policing in general means working (sometimes prolonged) unfriendly hours. If the phone is ever diverted please leave your details and I will contact at the soonest available opportunity. **It's Blue With Five Petals May 3**

It has been a very long time since I watched lovely Musk Lorikeets in the Adelaide city.

I heard them before I saw them – a lorikeet kind of call - but less harsh than the ubiquitous Rainbow Lorikeets.

And it took quite a bit of time to find them. How can a bright green and red and yellow bird disappear in amongst the leaves? They were hanging, head down, feeding on the abundant blossom but always on the inside edge of the canopy, behind foliage. Busy, busy,

busy. Their brush-like tongue is on full speed ahead, into each flower in turn.

Bronze! Silver! and Gold! on the one bird head. A real winner. Showing off, but I think that they have been a little heavy-handed on the rouge, don't you?

In the light you can see their sea-blue skull cap is only just visible. Their short tails spread into a fan of yellow and gold just as they set off to the next tree.

They were in a grove of red-flowering Blue Gums in the parklands.

This day, there was so much blossom and so many Musk Lorikeets (maybe 80) that the very aggressive Noisy Miners and Rainbow Lorikeets just could not keep up with patrolling the boundaries of the trees to chase the smaller birds away.

Musk Lorikeet often move in flocks – out of necessity! The Noisy Miners in particular were straight out of the book "Lord of the Flies" - ganging up, attacking, and living up to the moniker noisy.

Musk Lorikeets are mainly nectar and pollen feeders. They also eat insects - to build their body and bones and those of their young.

When the flush of nectar is gone, they will be gone too. Nomads of the sky.

### The Brinkworth Wardrobe

It is believed that the wardrobe was purchased in Nailsworth, County Gloucestershire UK, when Thomas and Elizabeth established their first home in 1834.

On 25<sup>th</sup> August 1839, in the ship 'Somersetshire', the family arrived in Adelaide, Thomas, Elizabeth, and children, Joseph, George and Mary. (John died during the sailing to South Australia). They had a small amount of belongings, including the wardrobe.

### The journey of the Wardrobe.

It is recorded that Thomas lived in Nailsworth SA in 1840. In 1842 the family moved to Walkerville where he built his home. In 1855 they moved to the Hundred of Gawler near Lower Light, then to Manoora. After the sale of his property, the wardrobe passed down to George, his son in 1881 at 'Willowdene'. The wardrobe was placed in the bedroom of George's daughter Alice at 'Willowdene' and taken to the new house in Edgar St. Brinkworth. After their mother, Louisa's death, Doris and Alice moved to Fifth Ave. St. Peters in 1924.

Alice Brinkworth lived her latter years in Fourth Ave. St. Peters. Following the sale of this house Alice moved to Resthaven, Leabrook.

After the sale of the Fourth Ave. house, Alice gave the wardrobe to Albert Brinkworth, the son of William who had lived with Doris and Alice at Fifth Ave. during his childhood.

When Albert left his home in Glenelg and shifted to Findon in 1986, the wardrobe came into the home of Albert's daughter Erica and son-in-law Eric Dagger.

The wardrobe was donated to the Brinkworth Museum in May 2020

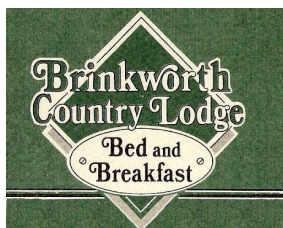

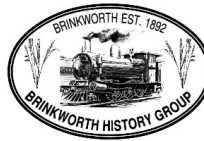
