# Administrator's Advent Message

Advent is the season of anticipation and of hope. It is also the season when we look forward to Easter, remembering that Christ born as a tiny baby will become the sacrifice for us. That is why the liturgical colour for Advent is a somber one, either purple or blue. But we do look forward to Christmas and the joy it brings because of the great change in the world, the revelation of God as a human being.

In St. Peter's you may look forward to a great change. The parish is in the unusual position of having lots of money available right now, but also having a serious negative cash flow. Spending is more than income and as the congregation has been reminded several times the current income does not allow for the employment of a stipendiary priest. I would hope that an arrangement to combine with the two parishes to the east would be consummated. By so doing, then without the cost of maintaining two buildings there may be sufficient funds to have a priest full time.

Change is not easy. There may be some sacrifices. Remember that the church is the people, not a particular building. The people of God may gather anywhere.

Some of you will recall the famous comment from the Duke of Lampedusa in the 1963 novel, *The Leopard.* To paraphrase, If you want things to stay the same, everything has to change. He was speaking of his position as a wealthy aristocrat, but he knew that compromises were needed to maintain his situation. That is also the situation for the parish of St. Peter's, Scarborough.
