Harry Houdini (Erich Weiss, March 24, 1874 – October 31, 1926)

handcuff escape, or rope escape, or even getting out of a straightjacket adds another layer to your show. Escapes take practice, of course, just like a coin trick. But, they're not as hard as they look. That's where the "magic" comes in .. acting! Houdini was a master of making something perceptively difficult LOOK difficult. There are plenty of books on this subject, and now there's Google. Got to Lowe's and get some rope. If you can do a simple rope escape, you can amaze everyone. You most assuredly will be doing an escape that Houdini did a hundred years ago. It astonishes every spectator who sees something from the past being performed right in front of them. Yes, Houdini started out as a "regular" magician performing card tricks and the like. Then he later found his niche. There were those who were performing escapes before him, but not like Houdini performed them. Houdini had such charisma and charm, that he captivated thousands by hanging upside down in a straightjacket by his ankles several stories up on a busy city street. And THAT was just a prelude to his evening show! Let's learn something new from one of our own great masters of mystery and magic.
