

Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

"Come to me, all you that are weary and are carrying heavy burdens and I will give you rest. Matthew 11:28

I read a story once from the gifted and respected theologian Paul Tillich. In the story he wrote about how when he was in confirmation class at the age of 15 and the time came for him to decide if he would accept the reward at the end of the quest he had begun; his classmates and him were told to choose a passage from the bible that "represented their personal approach to the Biblical message and to the Christian Church."\*

The words he chose of course are the words above taken from Matthew's gospel. As he revealed his choice he said it was met with astonishment and even irony. It seems the pastor wanted to know why a 15 year old young man would pick such a passage when he lived under happy conditions without any apparent labor or burden to speak of. Mr. Tillich wrote that at the time he felt a bit intimidated and even embarrassed as he couldn't come up with an answer for the pastor all the while knowing that he was right in choosing those words.

And he was right, because while these words are simple on the surface they are words that are inexhaustible in their universality since they fit all periods of life. Jesus was wonderful in the way He left us with words and phrases that grow and expand in their meaning as we grow and expand in our faith. These particular words not only expand as our faith grows but they are words that hold meaning regardless of who you are or what conditions you face.

While an adult may think that a child doesn't have burdens or labors on the same level as they do – it is certainly true we all struggle with the burdens we face. Whether we are two, twenty, fifty or one hundred years old we all face burdens in our life. And while this is true it is also true that we are all looking for rest from our burdens and somewhere we can find peace. And that is why these words hold such profound meaning. Because no matter who we are or where we are in life, no matter what status we hold or what season of life we are in, Jesus has said it is He that will relieve our weariness. He is the One who we can always turn too, the One who will always listen so that we can begin to find peace from the burden we are facing. It is in Him that we find true rest.


