Citizens Group Agrees to Name, Boundaries for New Municipality In Southeast BR

BATON ROUGE — After three months of debate, leaders of Local Schools for Local Children voted Tuesday to begin the formal process of creating a new municipality in the southeast part of East Baton Rouge Parish. The group's leader, Norman Browning, said a petition drive will probably be launched before the end of September.

The new municipality would be named the City of St. George.

Its boundaries would include all of the unincorporated parts of East Baton Rouge Parish south and east of the City of Baton Rouge, including the St. George and Eastside fire districts.

Browning estimated the population at 107,000, which would make the new city the 5th largest municipality in Louisiana.

Up until now, the group has sought to create the Southeast Community School District, and

Why New City Would Be Named 'St. George'

BATON ROUGE — The Cross of St. George first flew over Baton Rouge when the British established the Colony of West Florida here shortly after 1763. By 1766, the British had a functioning elect-

ed Assembly, which met in Baton Rouge. In the late 1700's, St. Joseph was established as the first church in Baton Rouge. But the second Catholic congregation was St. George. It continues to this day,

as does the St. George Fire District, which spans the southern and southeastern parts of the parish. Because of this history, Norman Browning said his group favors calling the new city St. George.


Plan Would Abolish CATS, Repeal Tax

Council to Vote Sept. 11 on Plan To Privatize City Bus Company

BATON ROUGE — An extraordinary number of scandals at the Capital Area Transit System (CATS) and widespread opposition to the \$165 million CATS property tax have led to one Metro Council member proposing that the entire system be replaced.

Metro Councilman John Delgado (R-Baton Rouge) asked the Chamber of Commerce of East Baton Rouge to help him "end the embarrassment called CATS." Delgado has introduced a resolution to be considered by the Council Sept.



Same School, Same Team, Same Street, Same House, Same Room, Different Worlds

Istrouma HS Star Grew Up In Same House I Lived in Fifty Years Ago



As a graduate of Istrouma High School, I have always felt close to the school, even though it fell on hard times back in the late 1970's. Two years ago, it was determined to be a “Failing School” and was taken away from the East Baton Rouge Parish School System by the State of Louisiana.

Today Istrouma has a new administration and faculty, an all-new coaching staff, and a much smaller student body. It has gone from 1,800 students when I was there in 1965 to 1,000 students five years ago to 250 students today. In a very real sense, Istrouma is undergoing a new beginning, which provides the opportunity for many of its old alumni to get involved and help out.

I was pretty upset to see what happened at the Istrouma-Central game last year. Istrouma didn't have transportation for the team, and so Central coach Sid Edwards sent a Central school bus to bring the Istrouma team to the game. He also fed them and brought them back to Istrouma. At the game itself, there were 3,000 Central fans on the home side and about 50 Istrouma parents and fans on the visitors side. This was unbelievable. Istrouma won nine state championship before I graduated. As recently as 10 years ago, they were ranked No. 2 in the state. But for many years, their program has languished.

My fellow Class of 1965 graduate Sammy Tippit and I dropped by

the football locker room the other day. We visited with the coaches and players. I love the coaching staff at Istrouma. They are some outstanding, dedicated men, real role models, and the football players have won my heart with their great attitude and determination.

But the team has so many needs. There's old beat-up equipment. A locker room falling apart.

As a result, we have organized a Facebook group called Istrouma Indian Jersey Club, and we're starting to get things done such as buy new jerseys for the kids. Friday night, we're organizing some of our Istrouma alums to come to the Istrouma-Central game, sit on the Istrouma said, and root for the Indians.

I was talking to Istrouma star Trie Gibson and asked where he lived. “On Conrad Drive off Winbourne,” he said. “Really? I grew up at 3326 Conrad,” I said. “That's my house!” he said. After talking awhile, we realized that he and I grew up on the same street, in the same house, and in the same bedroom — 50 years apart! We both attended Istrouma High School and played football for the Indians. It

was an amazing and touching moment. The Jenkins family lived in the house from 1959 to 1973. A devastating fire ruined the front of the house, and it had to be rebuilt. Trie was amazed because his house also had a fire. But when they paid a contractor \$12,000 to repair the damage, he ran off with the money, and the house has never been fixed. So Trie is living off Ardenwood.

Last Friday before the Jamboree against powerhouse Scotlandville, I asked Trie what he was going to do for me in the game. “I'm going to score three touchdowns for you, Mr. Woody!”

But he only scored two — a 77 yard kickoff return and a 65 yard pass interception! The young man obviously needs to work a little harder!

Two boys growing up in the same house 50 years apart. It's a bond that has brought us together in a very special way.

Guillory: GOP Man of the Year

David Vitter To Keynote Event Nov. 1

BATON ROUGE — Sen. Elbert Guillory (R-Opelousas) will be honored as Man of the Year at the annual Ronald Reagan Man of the Year Luncheon Friday, Nov. 1.

The event, which is sponsored by the Republican Party of East Baton Rouge Parish, honors a political leader who best represents the philosophy of the late President Ronald Reagan.

It will be held at 11 a.m. at the City Club, corner North Boulevard and Fourth Street in Baton Rouge.

Tickets are \$250 a person for the event, which is the only fundraising event for the local GOP each year. The party uses the funds to assist Republican candidates and to help with office expenses.

The keynote speaker for the event will be U. S. Sen. David Vitter, who will speak on key issues facing the U. S. Senate.

Guillory switched from Democrat to Republican earlier this year and has created a sensation because of his forthright defense of conservative principles.

Even before he switched parties, Guillory had established himself as a conservative champion in the Louisiana Legislature.

Guillory gained recognition in Baton Rouge because of his pro-family voting record and his support for the Southeast Baton Rouge Community School District in the State Senate.





BATON ROUGE — Voters in Ward 3, District 3 in southeast East Baton Rouge Parish will go to the polls Oct. 19 to choose a new Justice of the Peace. Judge Melva Cavanaugh, 74, died in March, and Gov. Bobby Jindal called a special election to fill her seat.

In the Central Community School District, voters will go to the polls Nov. 16 to decide whether to authorize \$13 million in additional school improvements. The bonds would be paid for with existing taxes.

In addition, several candidates have already announced that they are running in next year's elections. In Central, Jr. Shelton, who narrowly lost a race for Mayor in

Congressman Bill Cassidy and retired Air Force Col. Rob Maness are running for the U. S. Senate against incumbent Senator Mary Landrieu in the fall 2014 election.

To replace Cassidy as 6th District Congressman, businessman Paul Dietzel and Metro Councilman Ryan Heck have announced their candidacies.

Another election will be going on Oct. 19 to fill a vacancy in Congress from Louisiana's 5th Congressional district. The leading candidates are former Cong. Clyde Holloway, Mayor Jamie Mayo of Monroe, Rep. Jay Morris, and Sen. Neil Riser of Columbia. None of East Baton Rouge is in this district.

When you meet a professional hunter for the first time (especially one that has his own TV show), you have expectations and questions. Are they going to be like their show portrays them to be? Will they be arrogant or humble? Will they be rude or friendly? Will they live up to the hype of their TV image?

All of those questions were answered when Brian "Pigman" Quaca came to the City of Central, Louisiana, to hunt with my dad and me a few weeks ago.

My parents, David and Lydia, are the owners of Reynerson's Gunsmith Service, which is one of the largest of its kind in the nation, and we have been a part of the Central community for almost 20

years. David has also been the general manager for Bowie Outfitters in Baton Rouge for the past 10 years.

The first time I actually met Brian "Pigman" Quaca was at the SHOT Show earlier this year.

The SHOT (Shooting, Hunting, & Outdoor Trade) Show is a trade show for outdoor retailers from all over the country to see the newest and hottest product that will hit the market within the next year. There is also a banquet where the "state-of-the-industry" is addressed and awards are given out to some of the top advocates for the shooting industry. Brian has won the award for "Host of the Year" the last

three years for his show, **Pigman: The Series** on the Sportsman Channel.

We ran into Brian one night at the SHOT Show in January, and what was initially surprising to me is that when we asked him to dinner, he graciously accepted. After I got to know him a bit, I realized that I should not have been surprised.

He is a Texas boy from Groesbeck, just south of Dallas, and he is as engaging off-screen as he is on. I asked him if he goes by Brian or Pigman, and he replied with a Texas drawl, "Well, my friends call me Pigman or just Pig." After a couple hours of hilarious hunting stories and a delicious meal, we invited him to come hunt with us if he was ever in Louisiana, but never really expecting

to hear back from him.

But mid-July, we got a call from his business manager saying that Pigman wanted to film an episode of his TV show with us on the Beechgrove Plantation, just north of Clinton, LA.

After a few phone calls to set up the hunt, we decided to do an intense three-day hunt. It would require some late nights, but that could pay off in a big way if everything worked out.

Hunting is unpredictable! It is not always like some TV shows portray it. Sometimes you do everything you can do, and it just doesn't pay off. You don't get that big buck you hunted all season. The turkey you were calling just didn't come quite in shooting range. The wind conditions, weather, and game movement are factors you can't control. We were hoping that out of the three days of hunting that just one of them would pay off. Here's what happened:

DAY 1 - Pigman and his cameraman drove eight hours from Dallas to Baton Rouge. Then we took them another three hours south of Baton Rouge for our first hunt - Bowfishing for redfish in the marsh with airboat captain and taxidermist Freddie Smith. He owns Wildlife Reflections Taxidermy and guides for Addicted-2-bowfishin Adventures.

You may be asking yourself, "Why are they taking the Pigman to shoot fish, I thought he hunted hogs?" Well, we wanted to take him to do something that was uniquely Louisianian. As it turned out, bow hunting for fish out of a large airboat in the middle of

the marsh was just what we needed to kick off an amazing three days of hunting!

The airboat was the largest I had ever seen, and it had multiple lights surrounding the exterior of the hull so that we could see the fish below the surface of the murky water. It might have looked a bit strange to see a brightly lit airboat flying 30-40 mph through the South Louisiana marsh, but we were out in the middle of nowhere and it was after midnight. While everyone else slept, we were geared up and ready to shank some fish.

Little did I know, I was about to find out how good a marksman the Pigman really was! On TV, unlike real life, they can manipulate the footage and make the shooter look better than he really is, but they won't have to do that for this episode of the Pigman show!

Let's just say that any doubt that I had about the Pigman's being the real deal were quelled after seeing him shoot with accuracy and precision as he limited out on redfish before I had even shot my first fish! The Pigman hit his first five fish without a miss!

Those of you who bow hunt know how hard it is to shoot a moving target with an arrow, but bowfishing is a bit deceptive if you have never done it before. Not only are you hitting a fish swimming under the water, but also you have to aim about 6" below it to compensate for the refracted light that you see on the surface.

I can't reveal all of the details of our fishing expedition, but let's just say that it was a great success and you will en-

joy it when you watch our adventure on **Pigman: The Series!**

DAY 2 – After bowfishing until 4 a.m., we had to sleep a couple hours before we drove to the Beechgrove Plantation, just north of Clinton. John Barton Jr., the owner, was kind enough to let Jim LaCour from the Louisiana Department of Wildlife and Fisheries take us on a hog hunt.

Over the past few years, the hogs have been tearing up the farmland and cow pastures. LDWF has been given permission to harvest hogs for research to benefit the LSU Ag program. Even though research is the goal, the eradication of these hogs helps farming as well as deer management on the 8,000+ acre plantation.

Always resourceful, the LDWF

has developed a system to combat the South Louisiana heat — hunt at night! They are set up with thermal night vision goggles and suppressed .308 rifles with night vision capability. After just a few hours we had downed a few hogs, collected blood samples and gotten enough footage to educate the average viewer about the hog epidemic sweeping the nation.

If you haven't hunted hogs at night, it should definitely be on your bucket list! Stop by Reynerson's Gunsmith Service and see the .300 Blackout rifle with night vision capabilities that we built for the Pigman. We may even be able to build you one!

DAY 3 – One of the guys who was helping us with the hunt was David

Moreland, a wildlife biologist. He had pictures of a large hog coming to the same spot for the past couple nights. This could be the trophy hog that would make it on the TV show. We had one night left, and no room for error.

The hog had been caught on camera between 10 and 11 p.m. the past couple nights, and there was no reason to think that tonight would be any different, but as a precaution, Pigman wanted a small team to make as little noise as possible. So, he and his cameraman crept to the blind about dark and began to wait for their chance at a shot.

Many of you know what it is like to sit on a deer stand in the winter, and the boredom that can set in while waiting

sometimes hours to get your shot. Now imagine it is the middle of the night. No moon. Pitch black. You have to use your sense of hearing to determine if that is a 300-pound wild boar less than 10 yards from you or just an armadillo?

It is 90-100 degrees in the blind, which blocks you from any breeze that could possibly waft through the large live oak trees. The humidity is suffocating, and the sweat pours off of you as you wait.

And you wait.
9 p.m. Nothing.

10 p.m. You get restless. During the day, you can read a book while waiting or you can play a game on your phone, but now you don't dare turn on your phone and risk being seen in the dark night.

11 p.m. Is the hog going to come tonight or did we just strike out?

It is at this point that I can tell you with confidence that I respect Brian "Pigman" Quaca as a hunter! No one would have blamed him if he decided to call it a night and head on in, but he persevered and it paid off. About 11:30 p.m., I received this text: "Pig here on pins and needles. He's trying to come in. Sit tight. We will advise."

At 1 a.m., we were back at the camp with a trophy boar.



Sen. Vitter Speaks Out on Spending, Obamacare, Jobs at Chamber EBR

BATON ROUGE — Sen. David Vitter told the Chamber of Commerce of East Baton Rouge Tuesday that America is headed for severe economic problems and ultimately bankruptcy if the country fails to curb reckless spending by the federal government.

Vitter applauded the new, conservative-oriented Chamber for the stands it is taking. “You are filling a great need in representing real small business owners. This

group upholds the principles that made our nation great.”

The senator said he is an ardent opponent of Obamacare and wants it defunded and repealed. He questioned how President Obama has the authority to enforce certain provisions of the law and not others. “By delaying the employer mandate, he is intentionally promoting the exchanges” and that will lead to a single-payer government system, he said.

He said his colleague Sen. Mary Landrieu is “doubling down on Obamacare,” even saying she would vote for it again if given the opportunity.

Besides repealing Obamacare and curbing federal spending, Vitter said the third most important thing is job creation. The ranking member of the Senate Environment Committee, Vitter said the explosion of natural gas discoveries and new technology means

Louisiana could face boom times, if the Obama administration would stop trying to hamper energy exploration. If Republicans win the Senate, Vitter is in line to be the next chairman of his committee.

When asked the one thing citizens could do to help him, Vitter said send him a conservative, Republican colleague from Louisiana whom he can work with. Landrieu, a liberal Democrat, is up for reelection next year.

Delgado: Abolish CATS, Repeal Tax

11 which would urge the legislature to repeal the statutory authority for CATS existence and repeal the CATS tax. CATS was created several years ago by an act of the legislature and is a state agency. For that reason, while the Metro Council appoints members of the nine-member CATS board, it has little day-to-day authority over the operation of CATS.

Delgado wants to change that. His resolution would abolish CATS as a state agency and transfer its assets to the City-Parish government. In turn, Delgado's resolution calls for operation of the bus company to be privatized, or turned over to a private company to operate on a contract basis with the City-Parish.

Delgado said his plan would provide for continued operation of a public transit service but under private direction. Delgado says the City-Parish would subsidize its operations.

Delgado says that one of the results of abolishing CATS would be the repeal of the 10.6-mill property tax, which voters in the City of Baton Rouge and City of Baker narrowly approved last year. Instead, the Council would subsidize the new privately-run entity with general revenues.

Delgado said, "Some have tried to right this ship called CATS, but it's a sinking ship."

"We can't continue to throw good money after bad," he said.

He outlined his timeline at a meeting of the

Chamber of Commerce of East Baton Rouge last week. Delgado envisioned the following:

- Sept. 11, 2013 — Metro Council passes resolution urging the Capital area legislative delegation to pass a bill to abolish CATS.
- Spring 2014 — Legislature passes the repeal bill and provides for transfer of assets to City-Parish.
- Late Spring 2014 — The City-Parish issues Request for Proposals (RFP) to private companies interested in operating the bus company.
- August 2014 — The City-Parish selects the best bidder to provide the service.
- January 2015 — A private company takes over operation of public transportation in the parish and the tax is repealed.

Delgado said, "The money has been mis-spent or stolen. We need a change. Please call your Council members and ask them to support this change."

The Metro Council has a 7-5 Republican majority, and most are expected to support Delgado's efforts. However, Delgado will have to hold every Republican vote or pick up at least one or two Democrats.

Metro Councilman Buddy Amoroso attended the Chamber EBR meeting and voiced his support for the plan. Metro Councilman Ryan Heck was appointed to the CATS board earlier this year and has voiced views similar to those of Delgado.

The Metro Council will consider the resolution at 4 p.m. on Wednesday, Sept. 11.

that remains its primary goal, Browning said. However, efforts to create the new school district have been frustrated in the legislature by a handful of Republicans who have opposed it. Creation of a new school district requires a state constitutional amendment and a two-thirds vote of both houses of the Louisiana Legislature. The proposed constitutional amendment passed the Senate but failed in the House.

Browning said supporters of the new school district have been

encouraged by a provision of the Louisiana Constitution which allows municipalities to operate school districts without a constitutional amendment.

The five largest municipalities in the state are New Orleans, 343,829; Baton Rouge, 229,493; Shreveport, 199,311; Lafayette, 120,623, and Lake Charles, 91,623. The new City of St. George would displace Lake Charles as the 5th largest city.

In order to create a new municipality, organizers would have to secure petition signatures from one-fourth of the registered voters

in the proposed city. The governor would then call an election, and voters within the proposed boundaries would go to the polls and vote. If a majority of those voting favored incorporation, the municipality would be created on a date set by the governor, who would appoint the first city officials.

Under the Lawrason Act, which governs new municipalities in Louisiana, the first officials would be a mayor, police chief, and city council members. They would serve until a special election could be held to allow the voters to choose

their successors.

Voters in Central created the City of Central in 2005, and the legislature approved and sent to the voters a constitutional amendment to create the Central Community School System, which took over the public schools in Central in July 2007. Since then, it has become the No. 2 ranked school system in the state.

Browning said members of his group will be meeting with neighborhood civic associations to explain the advantages of incorporation. He said he expects opposition to the plan.

The boundaries would be the Mississippi River on the west, Bayou Manchac on the south, and the Amite River on the east. The northern boundary would follow the city limits of Baton Rouge and go as far north as the boundaries of the Central Fire Protection District.

Browning said some unincorporated areas, such as Town Center, may not be included in the proposed City of St. George because they are not contiguous to the rest of the new city. It would probably take an agreement of some type with the Metro Council for such areas to be included at a later date.

Browning said his group will be working to raise money to promote the creation of the new city.

and partner Jim Massey have begun Cane Land Distilling Co., which will distill and market rum at a distillery they are building on River Road in Baton Rouge.

All their raw materials will be produced at Alma Plantation.

Tharp says his mission is to "Embody Louisiana in a Bottle"! He says he wants to bring "an honest agriculturally-based spirit to market."

Alma Plantation produces more than 100,000 metric tons of sugar, and Tharp believes the new distillery will be able to use some of that production to produce a high value product that will bring jobs and income to the Baton Rouge area.

Cane Land plans to produce rum in three ways: 1) fermented immediately for rum agricole, 2) cooked and concentrated into a syrup, and 3) processed into both molasses and crystalized sugar.

Tharp said that "because of our close association with Alma Plantation, Cane Land will be in a unique position to use all of these processes to create our rum."

Tharp said direct fermentation and immediate distilling produces

the highest quality rum agricole, which is often produced in the French West Indies. This is used to produce the world's highest quality rum and will be a mainstay of the company, he said. Tharp said, "Rhum created from sugarcane juice has a different flavor and aroma profile from other rums."

His partner, Jim Massey, is a member of the American Distillers Institute. His wife Yvette is a celebrity chef and restaurateur. Their Master Distiller, Rory Donovan, was named Distiller of the Year. Tharp plans to start production in 2014.
