Don't forget!

IMPORTANT: It is vital that all invoices are paid by their due date, whether you pay weekly, fortnightly or monthly. We need to keep a close eye on our finances, and payments that are overdue cause serious issues for us. It may be necessary to introduce a late payment fee to cover the admin costs incurred by unpaid fees.

We understand that some parent's like to catch up with their child's key worker when they collect them from us.
