Ministry Notes

Before I started to write anything, I went back and re-read what I had written for the Country Chronicles last March. I was talking about spring and how the world comes alive. The grass turns green, the leaves sprout, the weather warms... So much optimism and excitement!

And ohh, how things have changed...

Don't get me wrong, we really did have a nice spring with green grass and leaves and all that... Unfortunately, it also came with a novel coronavirus. We weren't sure what to expect and we were pretty much expecting the worst. So, schools closed, restaurants closed, churches closed...

And if there was any silver lining at all, at least we all felt like we were in this thing together. It felt like there was some social agreement on what to do. But now, even that is pretty much gone.

Then we had the death of George Floyd. What was already a cranky situation exploded in ways we could never have imagined. Spawning still more violence and destruction and who knows what... If you're like me, you're wondering, "What's going on with the world?"

As I write, the virus continues to spread... Over 140,000 people have died, hospitals in parts of Florida and Texas have maxed out their ICUs. Researchers have better information, but depending on where you get your news, it's either really, really bad-- or not a problem.

And of course, we're in an election year, so all manner of spinning is happening. So, we're not only fearful, we don't know who to listen to.

It feels like danger and chaos is everywhere. I go through periods when I can't watch the news. It not only makes me cynical; it makes me paralyzed. There's so much badness out there! And that's certainly no way to live...

On August ninth, our gospel reading will be about Jesus walking on water. In biblical stories, water is often associated with danger and chaos. We have Noah and the flood, we have the Israelites crossing through the Red Sea on dry land (it didn't turn out well for the Egyptians!), we have Jonah and the whale, and even in the New Testament we have the story of Apostle Paul being shipwrecked.

When Jesus walks on water, he is not only walking on water, he's walking across all the danger and chaos that humanity can possibly muster—and that gives me comfort. Jesus is the master of our disaster.

So, especially when the seas of danger and chaos rage and foam, take the hand of Jesus and you can walk over anything.

Thank you for your continued financial support during this time! We know that many of you have added stress, expenses and maybe a decrease or loss of income right now, which makes your gifts even more meaningful. Giving has dropped in the summer months, as expected.

We received the **Paycheck Protection loan** on April 22 in the amount of \$16,500. We are currently waiting for more direction

from the bank and Small Business Association on how to obtain loan forgiveness. There will be more updates as the process moves forward. These funds are NOT included in the Income/Expense graph.

LWR Mask Making

Hello CoC mask makers!

I've heard there is more interest in making masks. Awesome! The Mission Committee will be glad to continue to collect and prepare them for shipping. As of this writing, Lutheran World Relief reports collecting more than 117 thousand masks to ship around the world!

Their website shows making masks with the ties, which is great. As an alternative, Sandy Luhman has an easy way to make them with ear loops; feel free to contact her if you want her instructions. Last time, it worked beautifully to drop the masks off at church where we packed them in groups of 25 and brought them to the warehouse for shipping.

I deeply care about this organization and have seen firsthand the life changing effects of their work in other countries. Historically, LWR is known for their quilts and kits. I encourage you to explore their website. Over the years at CoC, we have assembled school kits and baby care kits; other organizations assemble personal care kits, etc. Shall we assemble some sewing/fabric kits? This consists of cutting fabric to certain dimensions and packing it with two spools of thread. The kits are distributed and used for vocational training. Contact me if you are willing to participate and we'll arrange to get you a sheet of instructions. The Mission Committee is willing to purchase fabric and other supplies.

Again, thank you so much for participating in this ministry. I know we are starting to get busy with Taste of Welch so let's collect masks through the end of September. We can re-evaluate the Sewing Kit collection depending on how many of us want to participate. Kris Portinga


Buck-A-Chick – The Sunday School will be selling "chicks" for \$1.00 throughout the summer months How will we do this?
