

3. Social structure: population of the village


For the Neighbourhood Plan we need an accurate snapshot of the village residents: population; household composition and type; how people use the village and what do they want for the future





WOTG has:

- a higher proportion of 65+ residents than district or county regions
- a higher proportion of 65+ residents than neighbouring villages (Bletchington and Kirtlington)
- generally lower numbers of children than neighbouring villages.
- more than half of households with children have 2 or more children



The population of the village has increased by only 15% in the last 60 years, but the number of households has increased 110%:


 there are more houses with fewer residents living per household


This panel shows the most recent village population (taken from the census 2011 figures)

→ Of those, 64% are 65+






76% of houses in the village have more than 2 bedrooms

83% of houses in the village are owner occupied


Only 17% of properties are available for rent

5. Social structure: mode of transport to work

Mode of transport to work (111 employed residents; 16-74 age group)



79% of workers in the village use car transport to commute to their place of work

11% work from home



43% of commuters travel between 6 and 18 miles from the village – which extends to Oxford, Banbury, Aylesbury, Buckingham, Witney and Harwell.
