- 1. Declarations of interest have now been received from all Steering Group members.
- 2. Community engagement
 - Mike Finbow to update website with material provided by Alex.
 - AR to send email to all villagers who have given their email addresses to publicise the website
 - AR to write Village News update
 - Children's ideas/drawings: AR to advise RE of names and approximate ages if possible so prizes can be arranged.
 - Exhibition to be removed from Church on Saturday.
 - NM and RE will transcribe the post-it note comments on the village aerial photos.
 - Feedback from both consultation events plus post-it note comments then to be combined under suitable headings for easy reference. (RE + help)
- 3. Social and economic
 - Susan has published an analysis of the questionnaire response on the website.
 - It is proposed to do further survey work on local employment as responses on this were low despite there being a large number of business based in the village.
 - It was noted that we do not have definitive numbers of school age children from the
 questionnaire due to less than 100% response. This will need investigating further
 and, if appropriate, whether school or early-years education in the village would be
 viable.
- 4. Transportation and highways
 - It was proposed to undertake further survey work concerning user views on highways. (action BH/SD)

5. Treasurer's report

• The bank account is designated and cheque from Weston Front will shortly be paid in.

6. Housing and Planning Bill

• Bob reported from a meeting at CDC which included a summary of this draft bill currently going to a second parliamentary reading. A key point for us is that local plans and neighbourhood plans which zone land for development will be deemed to have conferred a planning consent in principle (PiP) to those sites. The PiP will come into effect when the document is adopted. This effectively confers an outline planning consent. It is proposed that the reserved matters planning application stage will be replaced by 'Technical details consent' which has not yet been specified. It is therefore essential that any development sites identified by the neighbourhood plan are accompanied by a design code which sets out any design requirements.

7. Preparation of Neighbourhood Plan policies
