Call meeting to order/roll call

James Swigart called the meeting to order at 4:30 P.M. Swigart – Chair, Craig Barber – Vice Chair, Heather Enzi – Member, Kayla Musselman – Member, were in attendance.

Approval of the September 10, 2019 agenda

Enzi motioned to approve. Musselman seconded; motion passed 4-0. September 10, 2019 agenda is approved.

Discussion and possible decision to award bid for Round Mountain Community Gym Floor

Rebecca Hansen reviewed the three proposals received. Dynamic came in at \$104,760 for 6mm and \$109,022 for 9mm. Sport Court which also includes the foyer, bathrooms, and corridor came in at \$79,944. Signa Sports came in at \$69,463.23, however they only bid for 8500 square feet and the bid requested 9487. Swigart mentioned they would like to look it over and make a decision at the next meeting.

Berg explained that Sport Court said they look like maple but the longevity of it lasts longer and won't have to be resurfaced often. Dynamic and Signa are the same type of floor just one is thicker than the other and our cleaning machine that we use on it now would be exactly the same. Dynamic actually came out to look at the floor.
