The Information Sheet and form for listing your UFOs may be downloaded from the PPQG website. Here is what to do:

- Go to the PPQG website (www.ppqg.org);
- Click the FORMS button;

You may now print the UFO Information Sheet and the UFO List form. Be sure to read the UFO Information Sheet. This sheet gives all the details regarding the UFO Challenge. Follow the directions and complete the form by listing up to six UFOs. Your first UFO listed will be due in January, 2020, at either Chapter Meeting.

The Night Chapter Meeting, November 12, 2019, will be the LAST opportunity to sign up for the UFO Challenge and will also be the LAST opportunity to turn in your list of UFOs.

Mystery Quilt 2019 Step 2 Correction


While making the Mystery Quilt, I found a cutting error which will also change one of the steps under Step 2. If you are trying to make this mystery quilt: please cut four (4) more light 4" x 4" squares, then cut 16 four inch-squares (4") diagonally.

This should give you enough triangles to form all the blocks for **Section C**. If you have any questions please give me a call, 757-599-0216.
