- Challenge Quilt-Crystal Ann Duarte-Yvette Cienski -The 2015 Challenge quilt requirements is to use 30's fabric and the quilt should be 30"X 30". The completed quilt is due at the June meeting.
- 2015 Budget Review-Mona Hendrickson presented the budget. After discussion the following motions were made at the day meeting for the 2015 budget.
- Motion was made by Susan Smith that the expenses and income for the day and night meeting be the same, this was seconded by Terry Hanson and approved.
- Motion was made by Natalie Hutchinson to make all income and expenses the same in the budget. Seconded by Loy Holt and approved.

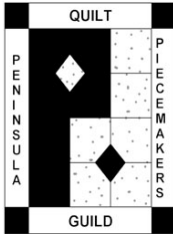
