- Challenge Quilt-Crystal Ann Duarte-Yvette Cienski -The 2015 Challenge quilt requirements is to use 30's fabric and the quilt should be 30"X 30". The completed quilt is due at the June meeting.
- 2015 Budget Review-Mona Hendrickson presented the budget. After discussion the following motions were made at the day meeting for the 2015 budget.

- Motion was made by Natalie Hutchinson to make all income and expenses the same in the budget. Seconded by Loy Holt and approved.
- The membership will vote on the Budget at the January meeting.

She also asked that the reference on the Guild web site be temporarily changed to PPQG Patriotic Quilts at this time.


