State News Updates

June 17, 2020

- Governor Cuomo held a press conference at 11:30 AM and announced the following:
 - <u>Total hospitalizations at 1.479 on June 16.</u>
 - Total deaths increased by 17 on June 16.
 - Total percent of tests with positive results on Tuesday was 0.96%, (567 positive tests out of 59,341 total tests).
 - Reopening:
 - With other states seeing higher rates of infection, the Governor is worried people coming into New York could spread the virus here.
 - Hospitalizations are also increasing in other states as testing expands.
 - Mid-Hudson Region is on track to enter Phase Three on June 23.
 - Long Island Regions is on track to enter Phase Three on June 24.
 - New York City is on track to enter Phase Two on June 22.
