*Physical custody refers to where the children live and who is taking care of their day-to-day physical needs and can be defined as either Primary Physical Custody where one parent has more of the responsibility of the day-to-day or Joint Physical Custody where that responsibility is shared.

*Legal Custody refers to who has the authority to make decisions about the life of the children regarding medical, educational, religious, and extracurricular activities and other significant issues and can be defined as either Sole Legal Custody or Joint Legal Custody.
