State News Updates

April 15, 2020

- Assembly Republicans urged Governor Cuomo and State Legislative Leaders to take swift action to minimize devastating impacts on NY's Farming Community.
- Governor Cuomo held a press conference at 12:30 PM and announced the following:
 - Governor Cuomo announced three executive orders:
 - Requiring nursing homes to inform family members of residents of COVID-19 cases and deaths within 24 hours. The order will include adult home and other assisted living facilities;
 - Allowing individuals assisting with COVID-19 response to stay in a hotel in New York City for more than 28 days without becoming a tenant; and
 - Requiring all people in New York to wear a mask or a face covering when out in public and in situations where social distancing cannot be maintained, such as on public transportation. This order will go into effect on Friday, April 17th.
 - o New York State will begin conducting antibody tests, prioritizing frontline health care workers, first responders and other essential workers, beginning this week. A newly developed finger prick method will be used to test 2,000 New Yorkers a day. Furthermore, the State is asking the FDA to expedite the approval of a finger prick test that would allow New York to test 100,000 New Yorkers a day.
 - o New York State will be sending 100 ventilators to Michigan and 50 ventilators to Maryland.
 - Of Governor Cuomo further announced that SUNY campuses are making about 2,100 face shields a day amongst 13 SUNY campuses, its four Cornell colleges, and its four university centers. Six CUNY colleges have adapted their 3D printers and associated materials to make elements that are used in protective face shields for local hospitals. All the face masks are being donated to hospitals, nursing homes, and testing sites across the state.
 - o The total of COVID-19 related deaths in New York is now 11,586.
