#### **Honor Quilt Note for October 2018**

On August 29, I visited Fisher House at Portsmouth Naval Hospital campus. I delivered 15 quilts to be distributed to active duty, retired, or their family members that stay there while undergoing various medical or surgical treatment.

I spoke with Jill, the director, about the current guests. I thought I would share their stories.

The first was an active duty member who had undergone a leg amputation because of an accident during a training exercise. The second was a service member recently diagnosed with cancer and was there to begin his cancer treatment. The third was a teenage son of an active duty member who was diagnosed with leukemia and was going through further testing. The fourth was a young couple from

Camp Legune who's premature infant was in the intensive care unit. The fifth was a soldier undergoing a general surgery procedure.

Jill said the quilts are given to the patients and they greatly appreciate that someone took the time to make something beautiful just for them. The cancer patients usually take them to the hospital for warmth. Others keep them on their bed at the Fisher House and take them home when they leave.

I wanted to share some of the stories to let you know that our efforts make a difference in the lives of our service members. The quilts made by the members of the PPQG provide warmth and comfort to those active duty, veterans, and families during difficult times.

#### Update for Service Projects

Since we didn't have meetings in September, we are expecting lots of baby quilts, hearts, and pillowcases in October. We have fifty pillowcases ready to go to the Blue Crab Quilt Co. in Richmond. Three hundred sixty-four pillowcases have been delivered so far this year. These pillowcases go to children with cancer at MCV Hospital in Richmond.

You may continue to support Small Service Projects in the following ways:

- Small baby quilts for families that are in need at Riverside Hospital and comfort quilts for babies in CHKD NICU palliative care.
   A good size for these
- quilts is approximately 30" x 36".

   Fabric hearts for mothers with babies in NICU at Riverside and CHKD are also needed.
- Full-size pillowcases made with bright, happy novelty fabric for children with cancer at MCV in Richmond should be made with 100% cotton fabric. Please don't use fabric with glitter. Finished pillowcases will be



taken to the Blue Crab Quilt, Co., in Richmond for distribution at MCV Hospital. They are rewashed and pressed by the hospital liaison so there is no need to wash and press them.
