- **Raffle Quilt**—Gala Damato-Gala has raffle tickets for sale; the cost is \$10.00 for a book of 5 tickets. Members are asked to purchase one book each.
- **Service Project**—Gala Damato-If anyone has an idea or suggestion for a new or different service project for next year, please give your information to Gala. If you have a suggestion, please provide her with following: the project, a point of contact and how many items would be needed.
- **Block of the Month**—Corrine Vance displayed the BOM for October; BOM's are available at each meeting for \$2.00 each. There were 28 blocks returned today from the previous BOM.

Speaker

Kitty Tully introduced the speaker, Karen Lee Carter, from Virginia Beach. Her topic was "The Ecstasy of Embellishment." Karen presented a slide show and also displayed and passed around many of her quilts. She said she was glad to be here, and enjoys being with us. Karen considers herself an embellisher--nothing leaves her studio without embellishments. She uses yarn, sequins, rick-rack, cording, decorative trim, beads, lace, buttons, charms, ribbon, floss, applique patches, Angelina fibers, foils, paint, paintsticks, texture magic, crystals, and metallic and decorative threads. Karen encouraged us to inventory and organize our stash of embellishments so we know what we have. She explained how to use various tools for embellishing. Her closing words were, "Embellish with Abandon!"

In addition, her quilts have appeared in national publications such as American Quilter, Quilters Newsletter Magazine, Quilt, American Patchwork and Quilting, two covers for the AQS Book Catalog, and five editions of Quilt Art Calendar. She has just finished her first Craftsy tutorial on free-motion quilting on a domestic machine. Pat is a Massachusetts College of Art graduate—she has two grown daughters, one grandson, and resides in Abington, Massachusetts with her husband, Matt.

Thursday, 12 November Fills, Feathers, and Fancies

Tired of the same old stippling? Perk up your machine quilting with a new vocabulary of designs for filling spaces and backgrounds. With more than fifty designs made to fit narrow borders, triangular patches or background areas, you will have no trouble broadening your design ideas. This type of heirloom quilting is done with little or no marking. You will end up with a portfolio of stitches to get your creativity flowing.



Saturday, 14 November Iced Blueberries



Make a beautiful two color quilt with a pieced center, flowing border and a shark tooth edge. Techniques, besides piecing, include paper pieced edge and fused blanket stitch appliqué.

A two color quilt is an absolute classic, always beautiful and timeless. This beauty works in a two fabric scheme or a two color collection of


many fabrics. Pat’s original border flows around the quilt edge with berries, flowers and leaves framing the pieced half square triangle blocks. The finishing touch is the tiny shark tooth border that complements the center blocks.





BLOCK OF THE MONTH for SEPTEMBER 2015 ... 12" (finished) PRAIRIE QUEEN

Your kit should contain: TWO 5" green squares; EIGHT 2½" green squares; ONE 4½" orange square, FOUR 2½" orange squares; TWO 5" tan squares, FOUR 2½" tan squares. PLEASE STRIVE VERY HARD FOR AN ACCURATE 1/4" SEAM ALLOWANCE ... If you find you are having difficulty getting the 1/4" seam, www.learnhowtoquilt.com has good videos, as both a refresher and some good tips. We all know how frustrating it can be to have a block not come out the way you had hoped!




1. Make the large half-square triangles. On the wrong side of the two 5" tan squares, draw a diagonal. Place right sides together with the two green squares. Stitch a scant ¼" on either side of the drawn line. Cut apart on line. Press toward green. **See Pressing Tip #1.** Trim these four units to 4½" square, aligning the seam with the diagonal marking on your ruler.
2. Make the four-patch units, using the 2½" squares. Seam a tan square to a green square (4 times). Seam a green square to an orange square (4 times). Press toward green. Now seam these two units together so that the result looks like the diagram. Press. **See Pressing Tip #2.**
3. Assemble the block, paying close attention to the orientation of each of the units, turning the units to match the diagram below. Stitch together in horizontal rows. **See Piecing Tip #3.** Press in the direction of the arrows. Then stitch the rows together.



PRESSING TIP #1. Learned this tip from master quilter Debby Maddy. When pressing a bias unit like this, first press the two outer edges of the seam, then press the center. Less bias distortion this way!

PRESSING TIP #2. In order to make this unit lie flatter, pick apart the few stitches within the seam allowance on BOTH SIDES of that last seam, so that they are free to move.




Pick apart these several stitches, both sides of seam.

Then, when pressing them, press so that the seams on the wrong side all lie in a circular direction so that there is a spiral in the center. Press

PIECING TIP #3. When stitching the units containing the half square triangle, try to begin that stitching line from the edge where the triangle seam comes together. That way, that very important point will always be the correct ¼" from the edge of the block.

Example: Begin at this edge



Not at this edge
