Letter to the Editor – Suffolk Times - Riverhead News Review

Elections Are About Choice and Elections Are About Issues.

I am running for the Office of Suffolk County Legislator to provide voters with a choice. It's time for more effective representation throughout the South Fork, from Moriches to Montauk, and Shelter Island. Fiscal Responsibility is the #1 issue.

Suffolk County Executive Steve Bellone and Rubberstamp Democrat Legislators, like incumbent Bridget Fleming, have put Suffolk County in dire financial straits.

- Suffolk County is hovering around “Junk Bond” status, after receiving 7 bond rating downgrades.
- Over \$300 Million has been borrowed by the Democratic Majority in the County Legislature to pay pension costs! Since 2005, the County's debt has more than doubled. This level of debt cannot be sustained.
- Taxes and fees have been raised over \$200 Million since Bellone was elected as County Executive with Rubberstamp Legislators voting YES to every fee, tax and spending increase. - Suffolk County is in debt to the tune of \$2 Billion Dollars. All that borrowing means that tax revenue goes to pay down debt rather than fixing roads, maintaining parks and providing other public services.
- A state appellate court has ruled a second time that the Bellone Administration's raid on monies set aside for clean water programs to pay for day-to-day operating expenses is ILLEGAL. All told, Suffolk County has borrowed over \$171 million from clean water environmental funds and now the taxpayers have to pay this all back. Raiding of environmental funds should be reason enough for any environmentally-conscious voter to NOT vote for the incumbent County Executive and rubberstamp Legislators who have allowed this happen.

I support John Kennedy for Suffolk County Executive because he is a proven fiscal watchdog and our best chance to Save Suffolk. It's time to stop kicking the can down the road and pull Suffolk County back from the brink of financial disaster. We must take the corrective actions necessary to restore fiscal health to county government. We must ensure government cuts spending and stays within budgeted anticipated revenues and not keep saddling our children and grandchildren with a mountain of additional debt.
