

Extract from the MESSAGE OF HIS HOLINESS POPE FRANCIS FOR THE XXVIII WORLD DAY OF THE SICK

"Come to me, all you who labour and are burdened, and I will give you rest" (Mt 11:28 Dear brothers and sisters,

Jesus' words, "Come to me, all you who labour and are burdened, and I will give you rest" (Mt 11:28) point to the mysterious path of grace that is revealed to the simple and gives new strength to those who are weary and tired. My brothers and sisters who are ill, your sickness makes you in a particular way one of those "who labour and are burdened". In Jesus you will find light to brighten your darkest moments and hope to soothe your distress. He urges you: "Come to me". In him, you will find strength to face all the worries and questions that assail you during this "dark night" of body and soul. Christ did not give us prescriptions, but through his passion, death and resurrection he frees us from the grip of evil. In your experience of illness, you certainly need a place to find rest. The Church desires to become more and more the "inn" of the Good Samaritan who is Christ (cf. Lk 10:34), that is, a home where you can encounter his grace, which finds expression in closeness, acceptance and relief. In this home, you can meet people who, healed in their frailty by God's mercy, will help you bear your cross and enable your suffering to give you a new perspective. You will be able to look beyond your illness to a greater horizon of new light and fresh strength To the Blessed Virgin Mary, Health of the Sick, I entrust all those who bear the burden of illness, along with their families and all healthcare workers. With the assurance of a remembrance in my prayers, I cordially impart my Apostolic Blessing.


HOW GREAT TO HAVE FR. LIAM LAWTON COMING TO ROTTINGDEAN



*** In 2006 FR. LIAM LAWTON signed with EMI. This was his first foray into the Recording world and his first Album Another World reached platinum status. This was followed by TIME and Christmas Song, both of which also achieved Platinum Status. Fr. Liam was finding his niche and beginning to receive recognition for his song writing ability. Performances include The National Concert Hall Dublin, Chicago's Symphony Hall, Carnegie Hall in NY, The Anaheim Convention Centre in LA ,The Paul VI Auditorium at The Vatican , and many of the world's sacred sites .

He has many TV and Radio performances to his credit and his songs have been translated into Swedish, German, French,

Tagalog and Italian. Being a Roman Catholic Priest many of Liam's Liturgical pieces have been translated and used throughout the world in sacred rituals and liturgies.



In 2001 while the world mourned the tragic deaths of thousands at the World Trade Centre, Fr. Liam's song ~ THE CLOUDS VEIL ~ became a piece that was used considerably by communities throughout New York and further afield. Followers of all faiths and beliefs seemed to embrace its message as an antidote to the tragedy and loss at the time.

Fr. Liam has become one of the most widely respected and leading writers of Choral and Sacred Music. His personal appearances and contributions to broader spheres have become highly noted and regarded. However, when on a number of separate occasions he was commissioned to write New Orchestral Suites exclusively for premiere in the world-famous Chicago Symphony Hall, with full orchestra, his status as a respected and singular composer was significantly recognised and assured in a wholly wider field. Fr. Liam however, has always been, and remains, a self-effacing ordinary

down to earth man. Although he has had three successful Top 10 albums back home in Ireland, to go alongside his considerable achievements in the

USA, his life and his Ministry has never altered and few who didn't know otherwise would ever think this was a man who has graced some of the leading concert stages of the world.
