DRESS UNIFORM:

Suitable: Pressed White long or short sleeved dress shirt with tie, vest and SLA sweatshirt
Not suitable : Polo Shirts, Turtle necks, blouses, t-shirts, or any other sweatshirt besides our school sweatshirt.

Suitable: Navy dress pants/dress shorts, skort, jumper or kilt - pressed and bright in colour with Navy socks (for the boys) and navy knee socks or tights (for the girls).

Not Suitable: Pocket/Cargo pants, joggers, leggings, worn out/discoloured pants/shorts, white or designed tights/socks

EVERYDAY WEAR:

Suitable: Polo Shirts, vest, White shirt/blouse and SLA sweatshirt

Not suitable : Turtle necks, t-shirts, any other sweatshirt besides our school sweatshirt.
