

The first of the year is viewed as a blank slate. Many use this as an opportunity to set new goals to accomplish in the coming year. Many times the goals are lofty desires but forgotten in a very short period of time. Others set goals that are difficult or even impossible to meet. Goal setting is a worthwhile endeavor, not just at the first of the year.

Unfortunately, most goals focus on this life and leave out goals for eternity. Pastor Adrian Rogers in preaching on goals said that when setting goals make sure they are goals you can pray over.

The business world often talks about setting SMART goals (Specific, Measurable, Attainable, Realistic, and Time –a deadline when the goal will be reached). To make them real, people are encouraged to write them down, this helps make them real.



Answer: A and B (See Matthew 3:13-17.)

The apostle Paul set some goals, one was to stop in Rome on his way to Spain, but God had another plan. In Philippians 3 he writes "¹⁰ that I may know Him and the power of His resurrection, and may share His sufferings, becoming like Him in his death, ¹¹ that by any

means possible I may attain the resurrection from the dead.

¹² Not that I have already obtained this or am already perfect, but I press on to make it my own, because Christ Jesus has made me His own. ¹³ Brothers, I do not consider that I have made it my own. But one thing I do: forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead, ¹⁴ I press on toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus."

Jesus spoke of the goal of becoming like Himself in Luke 6:40. There are other examples of goals in the Bible. It is important that we strive for something. Paul strove to be like Christ, an example to those who saw his life.

How would life be different if more people took on goals like those of Paul. Be an example of Christ to those around us. Forgetting what has passed and striving for the high calling of God.

What goals would help you be like Paul, or better yet, to be more like Christ? If you are one for setting goals at the start of the year, be mindful of setting spiritual goals.

We don't know what the new year holds forth, but we know who holds the future. This past year had many unexpected twists and turns for each of us. Some were smaller unexpected changes, others were pretty significant. Still, set as a goal to keep your eyes on Jesus, the author and finisher of our faith.
