The Parable of the Sower

*Only seed that sinks into rich soil can produce fruit; we must let God's WORD sink deep within us so that it can bear fruit in our lives.

Most of us hear God's word proclaimed mainly during the Liturgy of the Word on Sundays. A good way is to prepare the Readings and be attuned enough to God's word to hear and remember the message well enough to LIVE it! One way to live the paschal mystery is to take time each week – alone or with others – to sit with God's word and become attuned to the message. If we invite others to join us then we are even taking up Jesus' mission to teach others of God's wonderful deeds of salvation.

Think about the message in today's Gospel above* - The amazing surprise of this parable is that even if only one quarter of the seed that is sown produces fruit, that one quarter still produces much. The sower can sow with abandon because the harvest will be abundant- this is assured by God. His desire that the divine word be heard and lived is so great that God is willing to "waste" three-quarters in order that at least one quarter HEARS and RESPONDS. *The parable illustrates God's great patience with us*. This parable is an invitation to take great care to attune ourselves to God's word so that we can be numbered among His *'blessed'ones*.

<u>BAPTISM</u> marks the beginning of the Christian's life of Faith. At present we cannot plan celebrations until we are allowed to re-open our Churches for services but we can begin preparation now. Ring the parish office or e-mail to begin the process.

<u>Planning your MARRIAGE</u> – It is probably impossible at present to make definite plans, please remember that our diocesan guidance is that couples should give at least 12 months' notice of intention to marry in order to allow time for discernment, prayer and reflection. If you are engaged and wish to discuss preparation Courses etc. please contact Fr. Benny or Deacon Neil.

PLEASE BE AWARE

<u>It is essential</u> to be at the church <u>15 minutes</u> before mass starts, so that a steward can show you where to sit.

<u>Please enter</u> the church in the normal way and <u>exit</u> through the double doors at the rear of the church.

Important: Please <u>sanitise</u> your hands on entry into the church.

<u>There</u> will be no missals or hymn books and therefore no congregational singing during mass.

There will be no sign of peace.

Kneelers in the pews should not be used.

<u>Receiving Communion:</u> Please remain seated until directed by a steward to proceed. <u>Communion</u> can only be taken in the hand with your arms outstretched to the full so that there is the required distance between you and the priest.

<u>Important</u>: <u>At Communion</u> after the response: 'Lord I am not worthy....' the priest will hold up the Host to the congregation and say "THE BODY OF CHRIST" to which the people respond "AMEN". In the same way the people say "AMEN" after he has elevated the Chalice. This enables the people's Communion to be distributed in silence with no dialogue, as they have already acclaimed the presence of the Lord.

<u>There</u> will be <u>collection baskets</u> for Offertory Collection at the entrance and exit from the church.

<u>Please</u> disperse as quickly as possible after mass.

<u>**Our Lady of Mount Carmel**</u> is the title given to the Blessed Virgin Mary in her role as patroness of the Carmelite Order. The first Carmelites were Christian hermits living on Mount Carmel in the Holy Land during the late 12th and early 13th century. They built in the midst of their hermitages a chapel which they dedicated to the Blessed Virgin, whom they conceived of in chivalric terms as the "Lady of the place." Since the 15th century, popular devotion to Our Lady of Mount Carmel has centred on the <u>Scapular of Our Lady of Mount Carmel</u>, also known as the Brown Scapular. Traditionally, Mary gave the Scapular to Saint Simon Stock, an early English prior general of the Carmelite Order. Wearing of the Scapular is a sign which stands for the decision to "*Be open to God and to his will. – Be guided by faith, hope, and love – To pray at all times – To discover God present in all that happens around us.*

Our Lady of Mount Carmel was adopted in the 19th century as the patron saint of Chile, in South America.

O most beautiful Flower of Mount Carmel, Fruitful Vine, Splendour of Heaven, Blessed Mother of the Son of God, Immaculate Virgin, assist me in this my necessity. O Star of the Sea, help me and show me herein you are my Mother. O Holy Mary, Mother of God, Queen of Heaven and Earth, I humbly beseech you from the bottom of my heart, to succour me in this necessity; there are none that can withstand your power. O, show me herein you are my Mother, O Mary, conceived without sin, pray for us who have recourse to thee. Sweet Mother, I place this cause in your hands.
