Several years ago, while on vacation, my wife and I had the opportunity to take a balloon ride (it had its ups and downs). Unfortunately, the wind was very calm that day, so we didn't make much horizontal movement. The pilot did drop us down so that the bottom of the basket touched the Rio Grande River (made some of the passengers nervous); a maneuver he called "splash and dash" (as opposed to a "dunk and run" in which the basket gets several inches into the water). Our pilot concluded the trip with some history of ballooning, which made it an informative excursion.

We had to get up early to make it the meeting point. We then travelled by van to the launch site. We watched as the balloon was spread out and inflated. Finally, the time came to get into the basket (not an easy accomplishment or a pretty sight) and we were off. I have to admit, I was anxious about how I would feel about flying that way. I was relieved that it really didn't feel like we were moving once we cleared the ground. As we floated along there was no sensation of movement.

I am reminded of the prophet Jonah when God called him to go to Nineveh to preach to the people about coming destruction. Jonah confesses to the men on the ship that he feared obeying God (Jonah 1:10). When God punished Johan and he repented, Jonah finally decided to obey God. To Jonah surprise (and disappointment) the people of Nineveh repented. Jonah's preaching was more successful than he could have imagined.

I have heard missionaries testify that they resisted God's call to go to the mission field. When they finally relented to God's call, they went to mission field with great fear. But after serving on the mission field, they can't imagine doing anything more satisfying than doing the work God called them to.

Many times God taps us on the shoulder to do something less dramatic; but, because of fear, we hesitate or refuse to obey God and like Jonah, we feel unhappy with our choice. Other times we obey God and we feel joyful despite how hard the work is.

"for God gave us a spirit not of fear but of power and love and selfcontrol. Therefore do not be ashamed of the testimony about our Lord, nor of me his prisoner, but share in suffering for the gospel by the power of God," (2 Timothy 1:7-8). Paul is telling the young preacher that fears do not come from God. God gives us power to witness for Him. Because of this we should not be afraid to share the message of God.

While obeying God does not always go well and can bring about physical, financial or emotional pain; one thing that is sure is that there is great joy in living in obedience to God. In Philippians 4 Paul writes of being content, while writing from Jail; he knew that he was where God wanted him.

Are you willing to obey God? Are you waiting in fear, or are you willing to experience what God has for you?

A father's legacy

For Joseph Dodson, the pressures and responsibilities of parenthood felt compounded when he and his wife adopted a son. Dodson, a Bible professor, wonders if Jesus' earthly father also struggled with doubts and fears.

Scripture doesn't say much about Joseph, but he clearly left Jesus "a significant legacy," Dodson writes in *Bible Study Magazine*. Joseph obeyed God despite the risk to his reputation — by marrying a pregnant woman. Joseph, *a* son of David, raised *the* Son of David as his very own. To protect his family he fled to Egypt, foreshadowing the "new exodus" of Jesus' saving ministry. And Joseph heard neighbors mock Jesus as "the carpenter's son."

"Joseph taught Jesus much more than woodworking," Dodson writes. "He modeled for his adopted son how, for God's glory, he must drink the Father's cup no matter the cost."

Against the backdrop of people who avoid work, cut corners and do half-hearted jobs, a diligent [person] stands out. Practicing diligence is an excellent way to stand out for Christ at home, in the workplace and even at church. Today, complete each one of your tasks, however big or small, with diligence.

Pat Answers What do We do When We have Questions For God?

Many of us have situations or moments in our lives when we don't understand or have "Why" guestions for God. The Old Testament Prophet Habakkuk, which dates from the 600's B.C., can be very helpful for us. Habakkuk is unique because it is a dialogue between the Prophet and God. The book opens with Habakkuk asking the LORD why He does not punish His people Judah because of their sin. He does not understand why God is not doing anything when the wicked are flourishing and justice is perverted (see Habakkuk 1:2-4). So the LORD responds that He is going to do something. He is going to send the Baby-Ionians to judge His sinful people (see Habakkuk 1:5-11). But then Habakkuk questions how God can use people even more wicked than His own people to judge them. Habakkuk ends up saying he is going to wait and see what God will say to his complaint (Hab. 1:12-2:1). The LORD responds that He is going to also judge Bablyon and pronounces five woes upon them for their selfish, evil, violent actions (Hab. 2:2-In God's answer He reminds Habakkuk to trust Him, with the phrase repeated in the New Testament three times - "the righteous will live by his faith" (Habakkuk 2:4). The LORD's answer also ends with a reminder that the LORD is sovereign and in control even when we don't understand it: "But the LORD is in His holy temple; let all the earth keep silence before Him" (Habakkuk 2:20). These are good reminders for us all, especially when we are struggling of God day by day as you live for Him. with suffering and injustice.

In the final chapter of Habakkuk – chapter 3 – Habakkuk prays for God to "remember mercy" - verse 2. Then in Habakkuk 3:3-15 the prophet sees the LORD as a mighty victorious Warrior –"You went out for the salvation of Your people, for the salvation of Your anointed" – verse 13. We today must remember that God will win in the End and Christ will be the Victor over all evil and all enemies. Revelation is summed up by "The Lamb wins." But we must wait on God's timing for Him to make all things right. Habakkuk gets this as he says in verse 16 - "Yet I will quietly wait for the day of trouble to come upon people who invade us."

Finally the Book of Habakkuk ends with one of the greatest statements of faith in the whole Bible. May we be able to see a fresh glimpse of God's holiness, sovereignty, and goodness so we can say with Habakkuk even when we don't understand: "Though the fig tree should not blossom, not fruit be on the vines, the produce of the olive fail and the field yield no food, the flock be cut off from the fold and there be no herd in the stalls, YET I WILL REJOICE IN THE LORD; I WILL TAKE JOY IN THE GOD OF MY SALVATION. GOD, THE LORD, IS MY STRENGTH, HE MAKES MY FEET LIKE THE DEER'S; HE MAKES ME TREAD ON MY HIGH PLACES." - Habakkuk 3:17-19. May you trust God even when you don't understand and may it lead you to deeper faith for the glory
