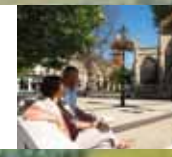

Let your group escape and explore a delightful new world by taking them to one of England's most tranquil and historic landscapes, full of ancient market towns, stately homes and rolling hills.



10.00am - Morning coffee and comfort stop at the Treasure House

A great venue for a coffee and comfort stop offering the perfect introduction to Beverley. The Treasure House's state-of-the-art stores are home to the Champney Galleries, devoted to the interpretation and celebration of East Riding heritage with a permanent display offering an introduction to the history of the area. From the first floor of the Treasure House a corridor links to the Edwardian Beverley Art Gallery which puts on temporary displays celebrating East Riding art as well as displaying national touring exhibitions. The building also features a fantastic panoramic view of Beverley from its tower.



11.00am - Discover the Market Town of Beverley

Wander through the winding streets of Beverley on one of our guided and self guided walks. Take some time to explore Beverley Minster, one of Britain's finest examples of medieval gothic architecture. Features include sixty eight, 16th-century misericords, Saxon sanctuary chair, Percy tomb canopy and a large collection of medieval musician carvings in stone and wood. Beverley Minster offers both ground floor and roof top tours of this majestic medieval church.

13.30pm - Colletta and Tyson Garden Centre - Lunch

15.00pm - Burton Constable Hall and Refreshments



One of the most fascinating country houses, Burton Constable is a large Elizabethan mansion set in a 300-acre park with nearly 30 rooms open. The interiors of faded splendor are filled with fine furniture, paintings and sculptures. Explore the magnificent parkland, pastures and wildfowl lake, not forgetting the 18th century stable block which is home to the skeleton of a 58 foot sperm whale. Bridlington Old Town Tours

Navigate the most complete Georgian High Street in Britain although some of the buildings date back much earlier. Visit the Priory Church of St Mary's and The Bayle which are all that is left of the Augustinian Priory that lasted until it was dissolved by Henry VIII. The Priory is celebrating its 900th year anniversary in 2013 and for more details of events celebrating this momentous anniversary go to visithullandeastyorkshire.com

The Priory Church of St Mary's

Founded around 1113 by Walter de Gant, for Augustinian Canons Regular, one of the earliest Augustinian houses in England, with an adjoining convent. Its foundation was confirmed in charters by King Henry I of England. The site had formerly been a Saxon church and nunnery. When complete, the building was over 400ft long and 75ft wide, with a transept which was 150ft long. The first Prior is thought to have been called Guicheman or Wickeman.

Ale Trail

The Yorkshire Brewing Company are offering unique tours of their facility giving visitors an insight how they use local produce in their real ale which is then sold to local pubs, bars and restaurants, as well as supplying local events such as the CAMRA annual festival and Hull's own Freedom Festival. You will have the chance to taste some of the different beer varieties and also bring a bottle away with you as a souvenir.

Lunch can be arranged at the Mission Public House where our English Heritage guide will meet groups for a walk round some of the historic pubs in Hull's Old Town. Spending a little time taking about the history of the Mission,

which among some of its features includes a library, many old books and stunning stained glass windows offering a poignant reminder of its religious past.

Following a hearty lunch your group will venture into the heart of Hull's Old Town amidst a labyrinth of cobbled alleyways and staithe. The Ale Trail takes you to some of the oldest pubs in the city which include the George Hotel - home to the smallest window in England, Ye Olde Black Boy - Hull's Oldest Pub dating from 1337 and Ye Olde White Harte - Hull's most historic pub, allegedly where the Civil War started following Charles I being turned away from the city by parliamentarians and leading to the Siege of Hull in 1642.

Hidden Gems of Hull

If you have visited Hull before and think you have seen it all, think again. Hull's Hidden Gems Trail uncovers some of the lesser known secrets of the city including Blades Shipyard birth place of The Bounty in 1784, the memorial statue and Gardens of a local legend David Whitfield, a remarkable example of a 19th Century Roman Catholic Church of St Charles and England's smallest window to name but a few. With a friendly local guide who has a wealth of knowledge, quicky stories and urban legends to entertain and enlighten your group at every turn.

Hockney Trail

David Hockney OM, considered one of the world's greatest living artists, was born in Bradford in July 1937. It was from his regular visits in the 1990s to his mother and sister who lived in Bridlington that re-introduced Hockney to the East Yorkshire landscape that he had first known as a schoolboy working on a Wolds farm in the 1950s. Hockney returned to the Yorkshire Wolds in 2002-3, first sketching, then experimenting with watercolours, before working in the open air to produce a series of increasingly large oil paintings that led to the massive 'Bigger Trees near Warter' in 2007, which he presented to the Tate Gallery. In celebration of this local hero Visit Hull and East Yorkshire has identified several of the sites of Hockney's most famous paintings to create a trail through the Yorkshire Wolds taking in some of the landscapes that inspired Hockney more than a decade ago. Designed for coach groups this trail includes refreshments and lunch stops at a variety of venues throughout the Yorkshire Wolds and can be tailored for your group's individual needs.

Prices range from £22.70 and £28.70 which includes coach travel from either Bridlington or Pocklington, guided Travel through the Wolds visiting 9 of the most famous Hockney landscapes, morning coffee and lunch. If you wish to travel, using your own transport we can arrange for a guide to meet your group in either Pocklington or Bridlington with morning coffee and lunch from £14.70 per person.

The route will take in High Street – in the heart of the Old Town and home to the Museums Quarter, Hull Marina, Victoria Pier, Trinity Square and the many hidden alleyways and courtyards.

Hull Walking with Wilberforce

Created to commemorate the 200th anniversary since the abolition of the slave trade, this tour looks at Wilberforce the man and his links with Hull. Visit the church where he was baptised, Holy Trinity, and his first school, the Old Grammar School (Hands on History Museum). Then spend time in his birthplace, now Wilberforce House Museum, which re-opened on the 25th March 2007 after a £1.6 million refurbishment.

Hull A Fish called Umber

Explore the sights of Hull by following its special fish pavement. It's great fun for everyone and the perfect way of discovering the city's new and old towns and its magnificent waterfront. There are 41 fish lurking amongst the city centre pavements; will your group be able to locate them all? Look out for the electric eel outside the electricity substation and the shark basking outside the bank. Your tour guide will be on hand to lead you along your way, and a certificate will be awarded to everyone who successfully completes the trail.

Hull The Hull Tapestry & Guildhall Tour

Enjoy a guided tour of the city's historic Guildhall and see Hull's answer to the Bayeux Tapestry. Sixteen years in the making, Hull Tapestry illustrates the history and achievements of the city of Hull over the past 700 years. Each panel contains thousands of stitches, ranging from basic tent stitch to the exotically named 'encroaching Gobelin'. The Guildhall tour includes visits to the Council Chamber and the Lord Mayor's Suites (subject to availability), along with the civic silver and insignia, artwork and sculptures. The Guildhall offers full disabled access. Available Monday - Friday 9am to 5pm

Hull Green City

One of Hull's oldest parks, Pearson Park is situated in an architectural conservation area and was once home to the poet Philip Larkin. The tour includes a visit to the Victorian conservatory, housing tropical plants, birds, fish and snakes.

**Beverley
Beverley guided walk**

Discover over 1,000 years of rich heritage in Beverley which is immediately apparent in the town's architecture, from the impressive Minster at one end of the town to the equally inspiring St Mary's Church at the other. In between the two, many of today's meandering streets were determined in medieval times by the stream which ran through the town. The winding streets, the Saturday Market with its attractive market cross and the Georgian-fronted shops all combine to create a town full of charm and character.

**Beverley
Elwell Trail**

With support of the Beverley Civic Society, the Elwell collection has been liberated from the confines of the gallery walls! High quality replica paintings have been installed around the town creating a self guided walk. Born in Beverley in 1870, the painter Fred Elwell trained at the Lincoln School of Art and the academies in Antwerp and Paris before returning to his home town. In 1914 he married the accomplished artist Mary Dawson Holmes and the couple settled at Bar House, North Bar. The town and townspeople of Beverley were a constant source of inspiration for both Fred and Mary.

The guide and map created to accompany this walk is available from Beverley Tourist Information Centre for just 20p.



**Beverley
'Beverley 20'**

The 'Beverley 20' is a walking route devised by Glen Hood of the Ramblers Association which links the Humber Bridge with Beverley Minster. The walk is linear in nature and marked with orange waymarkers as it makes its way along the Humber foreshore, through woodlands, valleys and fields that make up the south of the Yorkshire Wolds. The route is 20 miles long starting at the Humber Bridge and following the Humber before heading north across the Wolds to Skidby Mill, through the Parkland at Risby and finally across Beverley Westwood. Snacks are available at Hessle Foreshore and there are many pubs and shops in Beverley itself.

**Beverley
Medieval Guilds and Crafts Trail**

Central to the history of the town are its trade guilds which made Beverley one of the wealthiest towns in medieval England. St Mary's was the church of the majority of the guilds and their influence is ever present in the rich and varied carvings which decorate this church and the Minster. A fascinating story about the medieval period in general and Beverley in particular is told through the history of the guilds, the surviving records of which detail their structures and traditions. It says much about their methods that the forefathers of surgeons and dentists belonged to the guild which included dyers, barbers, armourers and cutlers.

**Bridlington
Bridlington Old Town**

Navigate one of the most complete Georgian High Streets in Britain although some of the buildings date back to a much earlier time. Visit the Priory Church of St Mary's and The Bayle which are all that is left of the Augustinian Priory that lasted until it was dissolved by Henry VIII. 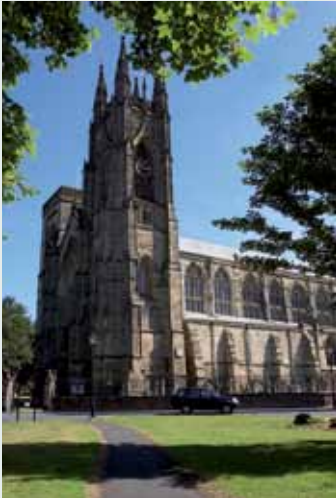
