PPQG WINTER CARNIVAL DECEMBER 10 and 13, 2019

Join your fellow guild members for a meeting of fun, food, and games! Both day and night meetings will have same carnival games.

Wear your ugly or humble holiday sweater and bring a dozen cookies or sweet finger food.

QUILT-O and games of holiday themed Bingo – 'purchase' your cards with 1 holiday fat quarter. You may buy 2 sets of cards with 2 fat quarters. Day meeting bring a pen or marker/highlighter. Night meeting can bring 20-25 buttons if you have them as we will be seated at the tables. Buttons will also be available.

Play Carnival games to win and exchange: Bring any or all three to play a game. You may participate in each game twice. Wrap your item, put in a small handle bag or wrap in a fat quarter.

Mug Rug and Mug – rug should be approx. 5" x 7" with 1 layer batting and a mug (does not have to be holiday themed) - play ping pong toss to choose based on high score

Pincushion – hand crafted – play darts, and choose pincushion based on high score

Potholder – hand crafted 7" diameter or larger, round, square or rectangular. Does not have to be holiday themed fabrics. Should have 1 layer InsulBright and 2 layers cotton batting, no button embellishments – play hot potato passing game to exchange

Demonstrations of make it/take it ornaments – YoYo Christmas tree, batting snow people, and spool or bobbin dangles. If you don't want to play games, bring needle, scissors and white/ivory thread and sew your ornaments.

PPQG Day Chapter Minutes - Nov. 8, 2019

The Day Chapter meeting was called to order at 10 a.m. by our Day Coordinator, Rita Crawford. We opened the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance. We had 97 members present, two guests: Yu Hui Tsu and Nancy Cheney.

Minutes: Carol Richardson made a motion to accept the October minutes as published; Jeanne Surber seconded the motion; motion carried.

Treasurer's Report: Treasurer made some corrections to the published minutes. Jeanne Surber made the motion to accept the Treasurer's report for audit with corrections. Bonnie Dodson seconded; motion carried.

Announcements:

- Jeanne Surber announced that we had received a thank you card from Sophia. She is an 11-year old patient at CHKD and had received one of our donated quilts. Jeanne also thanked members for bringing canned goods for the food bank. Trina Murray has agreed to take over as chair of the Honor Quilts with Isobel Meekins assisting. New member Linda Blotter has agreed to be in charge of publishing the Newsletter. Maggie Wampler has stepped up to be in charge of the Challenge Quilt for 2020. This will be our 35th Anniversary. She would love to have some assistance in preparing the challenge.
- **Symposium:** Linda Odell thanked all the volunteers who have been meeting to help with the organization of the Symposium. Registration forms will be ready soon. Contracts are coming in and Registration will start in December. Donna Dooley is in charge of Door Prizes for the Symposium and she has had good response from designers, fabric companies and members. She is still accepting donations and is willing to pick up anything you are willing to donate. Donations can include Ott lights, sewing notions, quilts and just about anything a quilter would enjoy.
- Mystery Quilt: Karen O'Kelley apologized for the confusing directions that had been
 provided and said that the directions have been corrected and further steps will be sent out
 monthly.
- Local Workshops: On Nov. 23, at the Grafton Christian Church, Rhonda Gianturco will be doing and instructional class on how to use your Deb Tucker rulers. Bring your rulers with you to class. On Jan. 10, 2020, following the Day Chapter meeting, Carol Pittman will be teaching the Beach Bag Class. On Jan. 18, Sandy Curran will be teaching you how to make a Photo Quilt. Melinda Dagenhart will be teaching a workshop, "Jelly Roll Jam" in 2020.
- **UFO Challenge:** The UFO Queens, Lois Bates and Nancy Shrout, are still accepting signups for the UFO Challenge through Tuesday. A total of six UFOs will be completed. There is a \$2 sign-up fee. Registration Forms are on the PPQG Website. The List of your projects is due at the November meeting. You can email your list to either of them. Project 1 will be due in January 2020.

- **Block of the Month:** Marilyn Rivera presented the November Block: Fall Colors. For sale today are both the November Block and the December Block. Cost of each block is \$3. November blocks were won by Crystalanne Duarte and Pat Sappenfeld.

- **Membership:** Registration for 2020 will start next month after the vote for the dues increase takes place. The dues increase proposal passed.
- **Service Projects:** Sherry Behun showed some of the quilts donated by members. We are still accepting quilts. Voting for the service projects for next year will be held soon. If you have suggestions for new projects or would like to continue our current projects, pass the word so they can be included in the vote.
- **Raffle Quilt:** The 2019 Raffle Quilt was made by Sandy Barnes and her Bee. Tickets were sold for \$2 a piece or \$6 for 10. The winning ticket will be drawn at the Tuesday Night Meeting.
- **Honor Quilts:** Trina Murray is our new chairperson for the Honor Quilts. She and Terri McHenry delivered 15 Quilts to the Fisher House. She has five quilts that are ready for long arming. She also has 3 quilt kits ready for members to pick up. Two quilts were turned in today. There will be a workshop on Dec. 5 to work on the signature blocks from the Fall Festival.
- **December Meetings:** Marilyn Rivera announced that the December meeting will be a Carnival. We will be having games, gift exchange for those who want to participate, and we are asking that each member bring a dish to share. We are suggesting that foods be finger foods so that we will not need utensils. Each member should bring a Holiday Fat Quarter. Call to Order: Marilyn Rivera called the meeting to order at 7 p.m.

- **Mystery Quilt**: Karen O'Kelly explained the problems that took place during the first part of the activity. She says the pattern and directions are all correct now. There will be new instructions each month. She thanked everyone for their participation.
- Workshops: Cathy Fowler gave the schedule for upcoming workshops. If you don't have the Deb Tucker rulers for the November class, you can borrow them from other class participants. On Jan. 18, Sandy Curran will show how to make a pattern from a photograph. After the day meeting in January, Malinda Dagenhart will give a workshop on making a quilt from a jellyroll. The workshop schedule will be in the newsletter and on the website.
- **Block of the Month**: Denise Vassar announced that she would be giving out the finishing instructions tonight. The finished quilt top is due in February. It does not need to be quilted by then.
- **Honor Quilts**: Terri McHenry introduced Trina Murray, who is the new coordinator. Terri and Trina delivered 15 quilts to Fisher House at the Portsmouth Naval Hospital. There will be a workshop on December 5. Trina has kits to give out tonight as well.
- **2020 Challenge**: Maggie Wampler said that more information will be coming soon. She needs a helper for the day meetings.
- **2019 Challenge**: Rhonda Gianturco announced that the Challenge quilts were on display. Fifty-seven people signed up, and thirty-two submitted finished quilts. She encouraged anyone who did not vote at the Friday day meeting to vote tonight. Winners will be announced near the end of the meeting. Maggie will take photographs of each quilt and quilter for the website. Kitty Tully complimented Rhonda on the theme and her work.
- Monthly Mini: Joy Duke showed the three donations: a tote bag and zipper pouch from Marilyn Rivera; a table runner from Isobel Meekins; and an angel doll/Advent calendar from anonymous.
- Marilyn announced that we have 55 members and two guests in attendance.

We had four quilts and 40 hearts turned in at the Day Chapter meeting and six quilts and one pillowcase at the Night Chapter meeting.

We would like to thank everyone for their support and encouragement for the past two years as we "led the charge" in providing quilts, pillowcases and hearts to meet the needs of our community. Each and every delivery was met with heartwarming gratitude for the efforts put forth by our members. It has been our pleasure to be able to co-ordinate these projects. As announced at the Night Chapter meeting in November, we will be stepping down from our leadership role for small service projects in January. This leaves an opening for a person or group of persons to take on this rewarding position. Please contact us if you have any questions or interest in doing so. It is not a difficult position and there are many in the guild who will step up to assist.

No one has come forth with any new ideas for small service projects for next year. I suggest we continue to donate to the same projects, until such time as a new chairperson takes over. That means we would continue to provide hearts, baby quilts, bereavement quilts and quilts for teenagers with cancer at CHKD as well as hearts, bereavement quilts, baby quilts, and throw sized quilts for Riverside Hospital. The throw-size quilts are for their No One Dies Alone (NODA) Program. Appropriate sizes are located on our Website.

Honor Quilts:

I would like to announce that Trina Murray is going to take over as the Chairperson for Honor Quilts and I will be stepping down and helping her behind the scene. I won't be able to attend day meetings or run the workshops any longer because of personal reasons. Over the past year I developed a spread sheet to help track the quilts from start to finish. There are 80 quilts in process or that have been finished this year. We have delivered 49 honor quilts to date and a total of 1,179 since 2005. I have enjoyed making the delivers and presenting the quilts as your representative. I hope the guild will continue to make and present these beautiful quilts to our military and first responders.

On Oct. 30, Trina accompanied me to Portsmouth Naval Hospital campus to bring quilts to Fisher House. I introduced her to the staff and we delivered 15 honor quilts, three baby quilts and some felt hearts for mother's who may have a baby in the neonatal unit. They had a full house and were happy to get more quilts. They are always very appreciative. The guild received a note of thanks from Fisher House for the delivery made in September. The administrator Jill said with the cold weather setting in there is definitely more of a need.

There will be an Honor Quilt workshop on Thursday, Dec. 5 at the Newport News Courthouse Way Community Center in Isobel's classroom. The workshop will be held from 10 a.m. -2 p.m. Please come prepared to sew, cut, and iron. Even if you stop by for a few hours we appreciate all your help. There are signature tops that need piecing and backs and binding to be made. Come for an hour or all day; your help is always appreciated.
