The Gift of the Spirit Acts 2: 1-21

Birthdays- do you like them?

PENTECOST

Some of us want a big celebration every year; some just want to mark the significant ones; and others would rather forget them. It has been hard for us to see birthday plans lost through the Covid-19 pandemic.





Pentecost is the birthday of the Church for on this day 3000 people joined the followers of Jesus who had been only around 150 before this.

All this happened because God gave a gift- the promised Holy Spirit. This was foretold by the prophet Joel who wrote of events over 700 years before Jesus.

How do people give us gifts? Sometimes we have hinted about what we would like but the best are the unexpected, thoughtful gifts given by someone we love.

When God gave the Spirit, although expected, it was still a surprise. It came dramatically with wind and fire and the disciples speaking languages they had never learnt. The symbolism behind this is the reversal of the tower of Babel (Genesis 11. 1-9). God demonstrates his power. Fire was the symbol of God's presence guiding the Israelites in the wilderness.

Wind represents the breath of God through which He created everything, but it comes here as a "violent wind" (Acts 2.2) to remind us just how powerful the gift giver is. And this gift was to each of them (Acts 2.3) but as Peter points out in verses 17 & 18 quoting from Joel, it was for everyone- regardless of gender, age or status.

What was the gift for? On the day of Pentecost, it was to give the disciples boldness to speak about God's deeds of power (v.11) and particularly for Peter to stand up and proclaim that Jesus, who was crucified, had been raised and that God had made him both Lord and Messiah (Acts 2.33). The Spirit helps us today to do the same- to help others know that there is salvation for those who call on the name of Jesus (v.21). He gives us power to be witnesses but also helps us

to be more like Jesus by growing the fruit of the Spirit in us (Galatians 5. 22-23) and He equips the church with supernatural gifts (1 Corinthians 12. 1-11, Romans 12. 6-8, & Ephesians 4. 11-12).

The gift of the Holy Spirit is to us all right now- not just for the early church. He is a gift from God and **God gives good gifts** to those who ask Him (see Matthew 7.11 & Luke 11.13). So we need to ask for this gift and then open it and use it. It is not to be left in the package.

And we need to keep on asking for this gift so that we might be constantly refilled with His Spirit to be more like Jesus, and boldly witness in our world today that Jesus is both Lord and Messiah.
