May I encourage you all to 'tune in' as you can and to hold fast as the body of Christ in these days. For others who cannot access online streaming, feel free at these designated times to join us in prayer and worship in your homes remembering that the Lord is with us all, as His children, in communion together despite circumstance. Services and short biblical studies will continue at these points in time each week and if you know of anyone who will not receive this letter online, do feel free to let others know about it, remembering to obey the parameters our governments have set in place.

May God keep you all safe, healthy and well. Keep close to all guidelines from the state and health services and we will see this through. Pray for others particularly in need and those who are suffering from Coronavirus. Remember those who have lost loved ones because of it and remember our health staff and those in authority at this time.
