Welcome to our new friends Montana, Dante, Rabia and their families.

Over the last month we have been focusing on our Mother's Day gifts and portraits. In addition, we have been working hard with our families to focus on toilet training with our older children and taking our shoes off and putting them back on.

The children have expressed an interest in colour recognition and counting. To support this we will be doing a month of colour weeks where we will focus on a colour per week starting with red this week, followed by green, yellow and blue. If you would like to dress your child in those colours each week, that could be fun. But please don't go out and buy anything.

We have different stages of counting happening within the room. We have those who are learning to count by rote, those who are learning to use corresponding counting as well as those who are learning to recognise the numbers. We will continue to offer the children a wide range of counting activities to support this interest.

We have introduced the doctor's play to our dramatic play area which the children are really enjoying. We are learning about empathy, caring and respect.

Just a bit of house keeping – could you please ensure your children's jumpers are labelled and also that they have a jacket (that is also labelled) as the weather starts to cool down. Could you also ensure each child has a blanket for rest time. Slippers for indoor play are also optional as the floors are often slippery if the children are just in socks.
